A Kingdom Agenda Philosophy

I started the **National Church Adopt-a-School Initiative** to prepare urban and suburban churches across America on how to rebuild their communities from the inside out by forging partnerships with public schools for improving the lives of urban youth and families. Church and public schools serve as centers for neighborhood activities, and more than any other institution, have a direct effect on how individuals will live and thrive in a society filled with social, health and economic difficulties.

The concept for NCAASI is comprehensive – to implement a national faith-based strategy to address the spiritual and social needs of urban youth and families through a church and public school partnership modeled on the Dallas-based Turn•Around Agenda program.

The church, not the government, is the best social service delivery system since it is closer to the needs of people, offers the largest potential volunteer force, has facilities for impact programs, and offers a moral and spiritual frame of reference for helping people make the right choices.

Using the local model, NCAASI trains and builds the capacity of churches and faith-based organizations to provide urban youth and families with a handup, not a hand-out by offering holistic, long-term solutions of meeting needs in a way that changes how people think, which ultimately determines how they live. I invite you to join the movement.

The structure to address social problems is already in place. We don't need to create new institutions in order to implement viable and lasting solutions; we just need to leverage that which we already have.

The church, in particular, exists as the best vehicle through which we find the necessary elements to achieve the purpose of social restoration, for a number of reasons.

First and most obvious, churches are located everywhere. In fact, there is an average of three churches for every public school in America. Consequently, churches are closer to the needs of the people since they are located in the heart of the community. In addition, churches offer the largest volunteer force in our nation. Next, churches already have buildings for housing community programs. And finally, churches offer a spiritual and moral frame of reference for helping people make the right choices.

Since many of our communities' issues are ethical and moral at their foundation, churches represent the most natural social service agency to address these issues.



This is how NCAASI works:

A church, or partnership of churches, adopts a local school in order to address the complex social needs of youth and their families by providing wrap-around services that link back to the churches involved.

These are some of the benefits:

- The establishment of the church, not the government, as the best social service delivery system, since it is closer to the needs of the people.
- A replicable program that simultaneously addresses the educational, social, and spiritual needs of urban youth and their families in a coordinated way.
- Improved implementation of services, local decisions, identification of gaps in services, prevention of duplication of services, and use of community resources.
- Better-equipped urban churches, assuming greater leadership for addressing major needs in the urban community, which is appropriate given its longevity and credibility in the community.
- The mobilization of institutions already existing in every community in America for long-term measurable change.
- A strong moral and spiritual foundation upon which better choices are made, resulting in stronger family structures, improved academic performance of youngsters, and a decrease in self-defeating and self-limiting activities.

In 2006, The National Church Adopt-a-School Initiative was officially formed to train churches on how to implement a proven model of social outreach in their area. NCAASI promotes community revitalization through church-based social services by leveraging the existing structures of both churches and schools. This is done through equipping church leaders and volunteers with the necessary tools to conduct community outreach programs scalable to each church or organizational size.

We do this through various levels of training:

- 1. Church and School Partnership Training
- 2. Comprehensive Social Outreach Training
- 3. Starting a School-Based Mentoring Program
- 4. Developing a Social Outreach Ministry (college course)

Our Most Popular Training Module is a six-hour workshop offering pastors and church leaders the building blocks for starting or enhancing the delivery of social services to urban youth and their families. Participants will receive an overview of the process for adopting public schools and creating programs, including school-based mentoring, to meet the vast needs of public school youth and their families.

Mentoring

When God says that He is a "father to the fatherless" (Psalm 68:5), He is not referencing an ethereal spirit floating around intangibly. God is a "father to the fatherless" through His agents of love - the body of Christ - as He raises up surrogate parents to those in need.

Statistics change to successes when mentors provide the guidance, nurture and commitment that is missing in a child's life:

Youth are **five times** more likely to graduate if they have a meaningful relationship with an adult.

They are 46% less likely to begin using drugs. They are 27% less likely to begin using alcohol. They are 52% less likely to skip school.

The National Church Adopt a School Initiative seeks to train church leaders and volunteers around our nation using our Starting a School-Based Mentoring Program. Through this course, you will learn proper preparation, orientation, screening, management, and evaluation of a mentor program.

Group mentoring

Involves one adult mentor forming a relationship with a group of up to four young people. The mentor assumes the role of leader and makes a commitment to meet regularly with the group over the course of one school year.

Team mentoring

Involves several adults working with small groups of young people, with an adult-toyouth ratio no greater than one to four.



School-based mentoring objectives

- To place caring, competent and consistent adults as mentors in public schools
- To have mentees demonstrate an increase in pro-social skills or competencies that protect them from a wide range of risk-taking behaviors that lead to school dropout, substance use/abuse, violence/gang activity, and out-of-wedlock pregnancy
- To have mentees demonstrate an increase in reading, math and/or writing and a stronger commitment to school thus reducing academic failure and school drop-out rates
- To have mentees master new skills and develop a sense of belonging and bonding among peers, family and community thus reducing anti-social behavior and alienation within their environments
