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Frequently Asked Questions

What is Bridging the Gap (BTG)?

Bridging the Gap is the oldest spoken-language interpreter training program in the country and has been in the U.S. and around the world for over 20 years to provide a foundation for medical interpreting. You can find out more information at www.xculture.org.

Do I have to attend all 40 hours?

Yes. Under the license agreement with BTG, in order to receive a certificate of completion you must attend all 40 hours and receive a final score of at least 70% on the final exam.

What happens if I don't pass the test?

Participants who do not receive a passing score will have the opportunity to take a makeup exam covering material for the entire course.

If I take Bridging the Gap, will I be certified?

No. You can refer to yourself as a qualified medical interpreter once you pass BTG, but you will not be considered nationally certified.

How do I become a certified medical interpreter?

Note that BTG or an equivalent program is required to take the certification exam.

What about ASL interpreters?

Sign Language interpreters have different protocols, and therefore, different certifications. The RID and the NAD are working together to offer certification examinations for American Sign Language interpreters.

Do I get any CEU's for this training?
