
# **August Announcements**

# **Practice Due Diligence with Contractors**

While we have written about contractors' coverage in the article above, allow me to discuss with you the potential pitfalls in dealing with the contracting community.

Our office gets phone calls from our customers who are attempting to find the "right" contractor to re-build their Jersey Shore property or to help with renovations. While we can give you a few names of reputable builders with whom we have solid experience, there are also many contracting firms that pop up after a storm and then disappear with your \$\$ (leaving an unfinished job, or worse yet, one with poor workmanship).

What I must emphasize here is that your home insurance policy does NOT cover poor workmanship by the contractor you hired. Your only option then is to start a legal action against the person who did the work; in essence, good luck!

Raising your home to a higher elevation creates its own issues. Check the contractor's experience in raising homes-including that of his subcontractors on the job. Get local references for this type of work.

Any contractor worth their salt should be able to provide you with references of prior work done and a valid certificate of insurance showing coverage for general liability and workers compensation. You should also check to see if the contractor has a State of NJ Contractor's License by going to <a href="https://newjersey.mylicense.com/">https://newjersey.mylicense.com/</a> verification/search.aspx.

Even after you receive a certificate of insurance which shows you, the homeowner, as a certificate holder, call the insurance agency that issued the certificate and verify that coverage is actually in place.
