Did you know that failure to comply with Cal/OSHA's Injury and Illness Prevention Program (IIPP) standard is the number one most-often cited Cal/OSHA violation when inspectors visit California workplaces? Today, Cal/OSHA has even more enforcement power for serious safety violations with the passage of AB 2774.

In California every employer has a legal obligation to provide and maintain a safe and healthful workplace for employees, according to the California Occupational Safety and Health Act of 1973. As of 1991, a written, effective Injury and Illness Prevention Program (IIPP), is required for every California employer.

Your IIPP is designed to help you provide better workplace protection for your employees, and to reduce losses resulting from accidents and injuries.

Your Injury and Illness Prevention Program (IIPP), must contain a general plan to keep the workforce free from work-related injuries and illnesses. Not only is this good business practice, but having an effective IIPP in your workplace could possibly lower your workers' compensation modification rate.

California employers that do not have a written plan, could be assessed a \$7,000.00 fine by Cal/OSHA.
