



U.S. Citizens Traveling to Canada

There is still quite a bit of confusion with regards to U.S. Citizens traveling to Canada. As of January 23, 2007, the <u>WHTI</u> requires American citizens to present a passport when crossing the Canadian border by air. So, all airports in Canada now ask to see passports from all people traveling from outside of Canada, including from the US.

The other date for travelers to note is June 1, 2009, which is when the <u>Western Hemisphere Travel Initiative (WHTI)</u> will require American citizens to present a passport when crossing the Canadian border by land or water. (The June 1st date was previously January 1, 2008).
