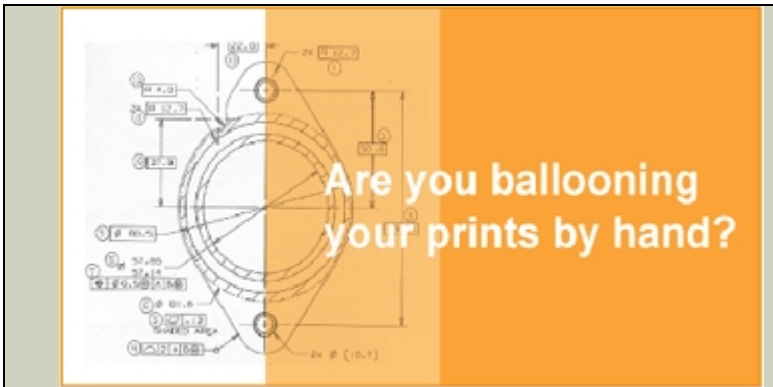

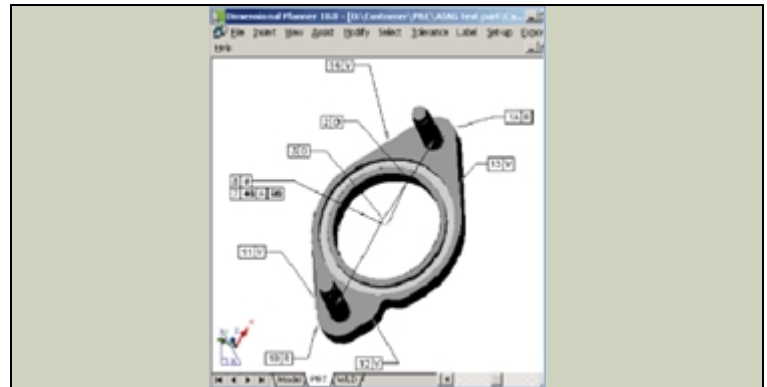
CheckMate Release Notes

“Software is no better than the support you receive.”

Origin International has the reputation of providing excellent support to their customers. In an effort to continue the high quality of support, recordings have been added to the CheckMate Release Notes starting with release 10.0.0033.

When a customer receives an update, it is a **MUST** that the CheckMate user reads the release notes. On the CheckMate DVD there is a **What's New** that can be printed out for reference.

More importantly, while in CheckMate the user can select **Help >CheckMate Release Notes**. Release notes are indexed according to releases. For example, there will be a book for CheckMate 10.0.0033 and under that you will find a page for CheckMate 10.0.0027-10.0.0033. This will contain all the changes and enhancements between release 0027 and 0033. Beginning with this release, you can scroll through all the enhancements and changes, where appropriate when more details are required, a user can select the recording and watch the procedure for that new enhancement. If you have not read the release notes for CheckMate 10, please be sure to read through them since the original release of 0018.



CheckMate 10.0.0033 Enhancements

Highlights of some enhancements in CheckMate 10.0.0033 are as follows:

- Access to CheckMate Knowledge Base directly from CheckMate Help Menu.
- CMS3000menu - Brings up a list of the last ten CMS3000 commands used allowing user to select one. See recording in release notes.
- OSNAPS are back on the right-mouse button!!!
- Editing the size of measurements such as Hole, Circle and Slot features, now accurately update the graphics and output target points. See recording in release notes.
- PPAP switch option added to the Edit Feature Properties screen, to selectively control which tolerances get sent to the CSV Reports and CheckMate Labels. Full details in Release Note
- CM Reporting now allows the generation of duplicate labels for a single feature (i.e. doing Roadmaps on one Layout page and then having detailed reporting labels on another Layout page for the same features.) See recording in release notes.
- Added more support to Dimensional Planner Checklist including Coordinate system awareness, Basic Dimensions, CMNotes and a cleaner Sorting Method.

U.S. Citizens Traveling to Canada

There is still quite a bit of confusion with regards to U.S. Citizens traveling to Canada. As of January 23, 2007, the [WHTI](#) requires American citizens to present a passport when crossing the Canadian border by air. So, all airports in Canada now ask to see passports from all people traveling from outside of Canada, including from the US.

The other date for travelers to note is June 1, 2009, which is when the [Western Hemisphere Travel Initiative \(WHTI\)](#) will require American citizens to present a passport when crossing the Canadian border by land or water.
