

## Dress Code During Louis Vuitton Cup, Red Bull Youth AC & America's Cup Race Days

On race days during race hours, the general areas of the Club (Grill Room, Trophy Lounge, Breezeway, Race Deck) will follow the Grill Room dress code as described below.

The areas which require reservations (Main Dining Room, Golden Gate/Northwest Room, Starting Line Room & Private Party Rooms) will follow the Clippership Room dress code as described below.

On non-race days, and one hour after the conclusion of racing, the usual dress code rules will apply. Members are responsible for making sure that their guests are properly attired.

**GRILL ROOM DRESS CODE** 

Casual. Shorts, t-shirts and denim are allowed. Flip-flops are allowed before 6:00 p.m.

No shorts, tank-tops, t-shirts, foul weather gear, cut-offs, or sports wear. No flip-flops. Denim is allowed. Jacket and tie not required.

## MAIN DINING ROOM DRESS CODE

Jackets are required for gentlemen with comparable dress for ladies.

## ST. FRANCIS YACHT CLUB HOUSE RULE 4.3 - DRESS POLICY DURING NORMAL CLUB HOURS (TO BE FOLLOWED ON NON-RACE DAYS AND RACE DAY EVENINGS)

4.3.1 ATTIRE IN CLUBHOUSE

Member's dress in the San Francisco Clubhouse is dictated by whatever is appropriate to the occasion. Dress becomes more formal later in the day; those who use the Clubhouse after 1800 are strongly encouraged to wear jackets (ladies wear equivalent dress). During the day, jackets and long trousers are generally appropriate; the wearing of a shirt is manda- tory at all times.

The Grill is less formal. There, sports clothes are always appropriate before 1800 hours. Least formal is the Starting Line Room, except when it is part of a Club-wide party or activity, and except after 1800 hours. The main dining room will not turn away hungry sailors in neat sailing attire who find themselves stranded without appropriate dress (if the Grill is not serving meals).

## Never permitted anywhere in the Clubhouse except en route to and in the locker rooms are: tank tops, cut-offs, wet suits, foul weather gear, soiled work clothing, bathing suits or wet clothing. The wearing of hats is not permitted in the Clubhouse.

The desired effect for dress is good taste, coupled with common sense.

4.3.2 DRESS CODE — With the approval of the Board of Directors, the House Committee may prescribe a dress code for members and guests using the Dining Room and other rooms of the Clubhouse.
