CH2M Hill

ITI's Devon Beasley conducted a variety of training programs at CH2M Hill's Hanford site in Richland, WA. Courses presented included re-certification for Overhead Crane Inspectors, Mobile Crane Operators and Certified Rigging Gear Inspectors. In addition, 6 students received training on Aerial Lifts.

The courses consisted of short classroom

sessions followed by a series of hands-on inspections.



City of San Jose

ITI Instructor Russ Donaldson conducted a 2-day Overhead Crane & Rigging Program for 7 individuals at their training site in San Jose, CA.

Attendees were instructed on rigging gear inspections, maintenance, load moving



techniques, load weight estimation and rigging configurations.

Xcel Energy

A 5-day Mobile Crane Operator Program was conducted for 11 individuals at their plant in Bayport, MN. Subjects included



load chart interpretation, leverage, static/ dynamic loading, load weight calculations and daily inspection.

Participants unanimously agreed that the strength of this program was in the technical and practical knowledge of ITI instructor, Jim Keener.

J. Ray McDermott

A total of 10 individuals attended a 3-day Certified Rigging Gear Inspector Program in Amelia, LA. Subjects addressed included



sling fabrication, quality control, and inspection removal criteria. Written exams were given, with a series of hands-on inspections

on a number of different types of slings and rigging hardware, which were part of the requirements to pass the course.

Bureau of Reclamation

Folsom, CA was the site of three 1-day Man Lift Operator Programs. The 17 individuals who attended the programs were instructed on the safe and efficient use of elevating work



platforms. Subjects addressed included machine stability, pre-operational checks, load chart interpretations and load ratings.

Shaw Industries, Inc.

A series of instructional programs were provided by ITI for facility engineers and maintenance personnel at Shaw Industries. The sessions took place at Shaw's Dalton, GA headquarters over the



last 8 months. The entire program was organized by W. W. Grainger, Inc., and included technical presenters from Columbus McKinnon, Lift-All and

Industrial Training International. To date nearly 180 Shaw employees have attended the workshops addressing sling selection and inspection, rigging angles, come-a-longs and chain falls, weight estimation, load control and hitch types.

Western Energy Company

Colstrip, MT was the site of a 2-day Journeyman Rigger Program. 18 students participated in the program which



consisted of eight hours of classroom in struction followed by an extensive series of field rigging exercises which

implemented the items covered in the classroom segments.

Students came away with a basic understanding of rigging principles, weight estimation, load handling, hand signals, and rigging gear inspection.

Bollinger Shipyards

Over 40 individuals have attended a series of Mobile Crane Operator Programs at various Bollinger locations throughout Louisiana.



The eight weeks of training, led by ITI Instructor Russ

Donaldson, consisted of both classroom and hands-on instruction. Subjects covered included crane terminology, load chart interpretation for various models of cranes, and crane set up.

During the hands-on portion, participants operated a variety of cranes at their site including a Manitowoc 4000, Manitowoc 2250, Gallion 22A, Lima 7700, 150 ton American, 50 ton Grove, 30 ton Terrex, and a 35 ton Linkbelt. Each operator performed a series of lifts and was evaluated according to their skill level with the cranes.

C & S Maintenance

ITI's training facility in Birmingham, AL was the site for five 1-day Rigging Fundamental Programs developed for C & S Maintenance. Each program consisted of classroom and hands-on workshops addressing such subjects as hitches & pick points, rigger's checklist and rigging gear inspection.



Buckskin Mining Co.

ITI instructor Jim Keener conducted two Mobile Crane Operator Recertification Programs for 10 operators at their Gillette, WY location. In addition, six participants completed a 1-day Rigging Fundamentals Program. Each course consisted of both classroom and handson training.

BP Cherry Point Refinery



5 individuals attended a 4-day Mobile Crane Operator Program at BP's Cherry Point Raflatac, Inc. Refinery in Blaine, WA. During the classroom portion of the training, participants calculated

load weights and completed load chart exercises. Hands-on activities consisted of lifting a variety of loads using the client's available cranes.

Attendees who successfully completed the program by scoring 80% or better on the written and hands-on performance tests received a three year certification.

Sulzer Pumps

A total of 5 individuals attended a 1-day Forklift Operator Program in Portland, OR. The classroom portion of the training included pre-op and safety inspections,

safe operating techniques and the effects of various types of loads on the forklift. During the hands-on



portion, participants demonstrated their operating skills while performing a number of required lifts.

Millennium Chemicals

Ashtabula, OH was the site for two 2-day Journeyman Rigger Programs. Each 2-day course consisted of eight hours of classroom instruction followed by a series of "live load" field rigging exercises. Rigging



gear inspection, load weight calculation and finding the center of gravity were just a few of the subjects addressed during the programs. Participants agreed the major strong points were the hands-on rigging gear inspections and determining load stress on slings.

ITI instructor Dwight Henson conducted a 2-day Journeyman Rigger Program



for 12 individuals at Raflatac's site in Fletcher, NC. The classroom and handson workshops were designed to increase

each rigger's understanding of rigging gear selection, proper rigging procedures and load control using any vertical or horizontal rigging system.
