A 5-STEP READING STRATEGY FOR STUDENTS

### STEP 1: PREVIEW THE TEXT FOR TWO OR THREE MINUTES.



- · LOOK AT THE TITLE, SUBTITLE, PICTURES, BOLDED AND ITALICIZED WORDS. WHAT DO YOU SEE?
- · ASK YOURSELF,
  "WHAT DO I ALREADY KNOW ABOUT
  THIS SUBJECT?"
- · ASK YOURSELF,
  "WHAT DO I EXPECT TO LEARN
  FROM WHAT I AM ABOUT TO READ?"



# STEP 2: GRAB A PENCIL AND READ THE PASSAGE ALOUD.

## STEP 3: WHAT "CLICKED?"

• CLICKS REFER TO SECTIONS OF THE TEXT THAT ARE EASY TO READ, MAKE SENSE, OR "CLICK."

#### STEP 5: PUT FIX-UP STRATEGIES INTO PLAY.

ONCE YOU'VE READ THE PASSAGE AND IDENTIFIED THE SECTIONS THAT "CLUNKED," YOU SHOULD:



- · REREAD THE SENTENCES THAT CLUNKED.
- SEARCH FOR CONTEXT CLUES IN THE SENTENCES BEFORE AND AFTER THE SENTENCES THAT CLUNKED.
- · LOOK FOR COGNATES IF YOU ARE BILINGUAL.
- · STUDY THE WORD PARTS. DO YOU RECOGNIZE A PREFIX, SUFFIX OR ROOT WORD?
