Talking Points for Standing Rock

Say No

- The Land Treaty of 1851 grants this land to the native tribes of the region—on that basis alone this pipeline should be stopped or rerouted.
- Join the 300 Tribes (90 on site) and 500 Clergy at Standing Rock who say no to the pipe.
- The original path of the pipe was close to Bismark ND where affluent white people did not want it.
- Exponential math shows greenhouse gas will soon skyrocket—we need to switch to renewables.
- Microfractures and leakage of highly toxic
 Benzene will occur and contaminate groundwater.

Say Yes

Profit
 NRG is a Fortune 200 company. It serves 3 million
 power customers in the US. NRG reports that of
 their technologies (natural gas, coal, solar, wind,
 distributed generation, nuclear) that solar power

is twice as profitable as any other modality.

- Jobs
 The solar industry only accounts for 2% of energy production in the US yet puts more people to work than the fossil fuel extraction industry.
 (Danny Kennedy: Sungevity and CalCEF)
- Math
 Exponential math indicates the cost of solar will
 go down precipitously while power outputs go up
 paving the way for the solar revolution we need.

Talking Points to Stop Fracking

Say No

- Halt climate change—stop burning fossil fuels!
- The "birthplace of fracking" Denton TX, has banned fracking following a town referendum.
- Jobs. A fracking project lasting 6 years in Lancashire UK would create 22 jobs. Insulating homes in North West UK would create thousands of jobs in 5 years and cut energy bills.
- Earthquakes. Oklahoma, home to hundreds of fracking sites, is now more earthquake-prone than California. 1990 – 2008, Oklahoma had only three quakes per year over 3.0 on the Richter. In 2013, Oklahoma had 109 quakes, 238 as of June 2014.
- Pennsylvania, a major fracking state, has just admitted that fracking has contaminated local water supplies 243 times in 22 counties.
- In California 3 billion gallons of fracking waste just leaked into aquifers containing precious drinking water reserves for residents.
- Josh Fox's film "Gasland" illustrates that homes affected by fracking have flammable water.
- An enemy of drought. Fracking requires as much as 8 million gallons of water for one project.
