STP and STC maintain leading-edge EHS audit protocols for more than 30 jurisdictions. The protocol documents are written in English and are available in MS Word, Adobe Acrobat and Excel formats, as well as through STP's web-based portal or can be integrated into an existing company platform. Using the protocols' custom templates and advanced functionality features, auditors can easily track audit findings and manage data over time to improve compliance, risk management and safety performance. In addition, STP's formatting is compatible with leading risk management and sustainability platform providers.

Highlights of selected legislation covered in the newly updated protocol include:

- "CONAMA Resolution No. 436 of December 22, 2011" establishes maximum limits for air emissions from fixed sources. This resolution complements "CONAMA Resolutions 05/1989" and "382/2006," and establishes maximum emission limits for air pollutants from installed fixed sources or sources that requested an installation license prior to January 2, 2007.

- "Decree No. 3048, of May 6, 1999" approves the "Regulation of the Social Security," and provides other measures with regard to reporting work related accidents and the corresponding sanctions for failing to comply with established requirements.

- "SMA Resolution No. 49 of May 28, 2014" was adopted to regulate the procedures for environmental licensing, with environmental impact assessment, under the Environmental Agency of the State of São Paulo and replaces "SMA Resolution No. 54 of November 30, 2004," which previously provided for the environmental licensing in the State of São Paulo.

- "CONSEMA Normative Deliberation 1 of April 23, 2014" establishes guidelines for municipal environmental licensing of projects or activities with local impact potential in the State of São Paulo.

- "Ordinance MTE No. 594 of April 28, 2014" provides a new name and wording for the "Norm No 13 - Boilers and Pressure Vessels," as well as establishing deadlines for its implementation and compliance.
- "CONAMA Resolution No. 452 of July 2, 2012" provides control procedures for waste import following the standards adopted by the Basel Convention on the Control of Transboundary Movements of Hazardous Wastes and their Disposal. This resolution replaces "CONAMA Resolution No. 23 of December 12, 1996" that established requirements for the transboundary movement of hazardous wastes within countries that are members of the Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development ("OECD countries").

- "IBAMA Normative Instruction No. 12 of July 16, 2013" provides for the regulation of waste import control procedures referred to in "CONAMA Resolution No. 452 of July 2, 2012," in accordance with the Basel



Convention.

- The 2016 edition of "NBR-9735, Emergency Equipment for Ground Transportation of Dangerous Goods" has replaced the 2012 edition of "NBR-9735." This standard establishes the minimum emergency equipment required for the ground transportation of dangerous goods, including: personal protective equipment (PPE) to be used by the driver and any personnel involved in the transport; equipment for signaling areas of failure, accident and/or emergencies; and portable fire extinguishers.
