The Courtauld Institute of Art Preserves and Publishes its Prestigious Collection with Portfolio

Where they started...

The Courtauld Institute of Art, one of the world's leading centres for the study of art history and conservation, is also home to a remarkable art collection that includes more than 550 paintings, 9,500 prints and 35,000 photographs. Located at Somerset House, on Museum Mile, in London, the collection includes masterpieces from the early Renaissance into the 20th century and is particularly renowned for its unrivalled collection of Impressionist and Post-Impressionist paintings. These include Van Gogh's Self Portrait with a Bandaged Ear and A Bar at the Folies Bergère by Édouard Manet. Highlights from the Renaissance collection include several works by Botticelli together with Lucas Cranach the Elder's Adam and Eve.

Following a National Lottery Grant in 2001, The Courtauld Institute initially invested in an outsourced digital asset management (DAM) solution; however, this turned out to be both expensive and time consuming since it proved difficult to make modifications to the database.

What they did...

Keen to digitise the Institute's entire collection and place these image libraries online, The Courtauld Institute went in search for an alternative DAM solution that was not only cost effective, but also easy to configure and maintain internally. It was also imperative the new solution should integrate seamlessly with the Institute's Collections Management System--MuseumPlus by zetcom.
