Visual	Visual ability sufficient for observation and assessment necessary in respiratory care	 Observe patient presentation and responses Observe visual alarms when monitoring respiratory and other patient care monitoring equipment Identification of patient, verification of oxygen flow, possess color vision to properly identify color on medical gas cylinders
Tactile	Tactile ability sufficient for physical assessment	 Perform palpation functions of physical examination and / or those related to therapeutic intervention Demonstrate method for palpating arterial sites
