Who are the Faculty?

At this session you are being taught by fiftyfour faculty members from sixteen states plus Mexico. All of our sponsoring states, with the exception of West Virginia, are represented on our faculty as well as two non-sponsoring states. The faculty is a diverse, and highly experienced group of individuals.

Bankers make up 38% of the faculty and the next largest group is consultants. But 53% of the consultants are former bankers and if this group is added to the "banker" category, bankers account for 59% of the faculty. Academics are 18% of the faculty and 12% of your teachers are "other" which includes regulators, attorneys and other professionals.

Deadline Extensions on BSPs

The School is quite strict in adhering to the due dates for the bank study projects. You can appreciate the fact that it is quite a chore to keep track of over 400 projects arriving monthly during the period September through February. To avoid the "late" stamp, projects must be postmarked by the 15th of the month due. Projects mailed later receive an automatic "C" grade.

It is inevitable that situations develop in people's lives that prevent the completion of the projects by their due dates. In such cases, extensions are granted for a two week period. <u>Requests for</u> <u>extensions should be made prior to the deadline</u>. If granted by Dr. Woodland, bankers are often required to wash his car during the session or mow his grass!

Mexican Colleagues

This year we welcome 17 bank officers from Mexico to the campus. About 15 years ago the largest independent bank in Mexico, Banorte which is based in Monterrey, enrolled a couple of bankers who, along with the bank, found the experience very rewarding so the bank has continued to send students and at this session 32 Banorte bankers are on campus. Banorte has about \$70 billion in assets and over 20,000 employees.

Last year we welcomed five bankers from Banco del Bajio in Leon, Mexico and they are joined at this session by five of their colleagues. The bank operates in 27 of the 32 states in Mexico and is celebrating 20 years in operation this year. We welcome these bankers to the school. To date we have graduated 181 bankers from Mexico.

One of the courses well received by the students is the senior capstone course Bank Simulation. The origins of this course date back to the 1970's when the FDIC and the American Bankers Association joined forces to simulate the banking industry. Since that time the program has undergone many, many improvements to incorporate changes in the industry. The present program, which is owned by the School, is updated and modified annually under a partnership with the banking schools at the Universities of Colorado and Washington.

Dr. Ernie Swift is the coordinator of the course and works closely with our two other university partners to assure that the program delivers the best possible learning experience to members of the senior class. The time and effort Ernie devotes to this project is substantial and much appreciated.
