# **City of Québec Municipal Government Acquires IT Automation Solution with** Automic Dollar Universe

With over 7,000 employees, the City of Québec municipal government's mission is to provide services in public safety, public works, and culture, as well as urban planning, tourism, and economic development. The City of Québec IT Department supports mission-critical applications that are indispensable in delivering these services.

Following the merging of 13 municipalities in 2001, a series of challenges was created with the IT team needing to support and integrate critical business applications for finance and accounting, human resources, Geographic Info Systems, and other processing. With many of these applications significantly relying on batch workload, the City decided to invest in an automated job scheduler that would manage the dependencies required to provide reliable service for all their internal and external customers.

### IT Challenge

Executing a daily workload featuring a mix of Oracle E-Business Suite and custom applications across a heterogeneous UNIX and Windows server environment, the City of Québec's IT group realized that the right automation tool could help keep the business of government running. Unfortunately, their legacy scheduling tool was complex to use, costly to maintain and failed to provide visibility over IT Operations. As a consequence, staff needed to continually monitor jobs, manually checking and correcting problems as and when they occurred - defeating the purpose of having an automated scheduler.
