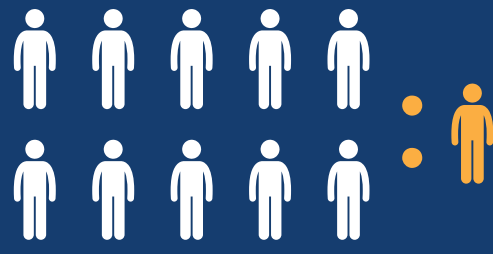

Clerkships in 1 Location

Scheduled by our clerkship coordinators, students complete all of their core rotations at one location in Warner Robins, Georgia. This level of individualized training sets Trinity apart from any other U.S. or international medical school because students get to know the advising medical staff and receive guidance.
