Conditions of entry

To be considered for an award the following conditions of entry must be met:

- The application form must be completed and signed by the applicant and appropriate referee(s).
- Applicants must meet the eligibility criteria.
- Applicants must personally address all selection criteria.
- All applicants must agree to abide by the decision of the judges and no appeals will be entered into.
- Nominations received after the closing date will not be considered.

Closing date

8 March 2017

Documents to be provided

- Completed Meat Industry Vocational Student of the Year Training Award Entry Form.
- Written submission, not exceeding five A4 pages, including photographs.
- Photograph of the applicant, suitable for reproduction.

Required structure of the written submission

Introduction

Provide a short overview covering a description of the qualification you enrolled in, your Registered Training Organisation and employer, as well as your reason for choosing this industry and training path.

1. What are your career and study achievements and plans?

- Your achievements through your job and your studies.
- Your awareness of the value of learning.



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- Your understanding of the value of training.
- Your future career plans.

2. What communication, team and leadership skills do you possess?

- Your oral and written communication skills.
- Your level of self-reliance and resilience in times of challenge.
- Your ability to be an effective team participant.
- Your ability to be a leader and promote your training, industry or other things you are involved in.
- Your capacity to be an effective ambassador for your industry, community and Australia.

3. What have you achieved in other pursuits?

- Your achievements in areas other than study and work.
- Your involvement in community activities.
- Your awareness of current social, economic and political issues.

4. Are you able to represent the national training system at a broader level?

- Any knowledge or understanding you have gained of new developments and trends in your workplace or industry and the vocational education and training system.
- Any messages you might have that could encourage others who are interested in entering your training pathway.
