# Guidelines for Grant Applicants

Welcome to the Keepers of the Earth (KOE) Fund Guidelines and Grant Application. First Peoples Worldwide (First Peoples) awards KOE grants to projects that empower Indigenous communities. This encompasses a wide range of projects, and we try not to place too many restrictions on the type of project we will fund. *To be eligible for a KOE grant, all applicants must:* 

- Be Indigenous-led or represent an Indigenous-led project
- Be a grassroots/local organization or group
- ♦ Have an organizational bank account or access to a fiscal sponsor

Because of our grantmaking mission and limited grant funds, we do not fund:

- Projects that do not originate from or are not led by an Indigenous community
- Event fundraising, fundraising campaigns, costs associated with the soliciting of endowment funds, or deficit funding
- Travel to the United States
- Electoral campaign activities
- Disaster relief
- Work being done by an individual

- Conference registration fees
- Missionary projects
- Fees associated with lawsuit proceedings or representation
- Scholarships or school application fees
- Documentaries and/or filmmaking
- Vocational education or training

The KOE Fund was created to support Indigenous grassroots development and is often the first funding source for emerging Indigenous organizations and projects. We consider all applications on a case-by-case basis but prioritize small organizations with annual budgets less than US\$150,000. If your organization's annual budget is more than US\$150,000, please contact us to discuss your project.

Grant amounts for first-time applicants range from Us\$500 to Us\$5,000. Upon successful completion of your initial grant, you may apply for a second grant of up to Us\$10,000. Because our grantmaking is geared toward Indigenous start-up groups' projects, your second grant application is more likely to be funded if you can demonstrate that you are pursuing other sources of funding.

We will consider funding an organization a maximum of three times. We will only fund your organization a third time if you have secured additional sources of funding other than from First Peoples.

At First Peoples, we don't see ourselves as gatekeepers of funding, but as partners with our communities. We have crafted our grantmaking process to be an equal and reciprocal dialogue with our grantees. Our grant decisions are based on whether proposed projects share our values, goals, and philosophy in supporting Indigenous Peoples.

If your project is selected for funding, your organization will be invited to participate in our Grantee Mentorship Program, which aims to strengthen the global network of grassroots Indigenous organizations working to address similar challenges in their communities.

#### PROJECT CRITERIA

Here are the basic questions we ask ourselves when considering a grant application:

## *Is the project community initiated?*

It is important for Indigenous communities to be in control of their own development and, therefore, their own destinies. First Peoples Worldwide strongly prefers to fund development projects that are imagined and implemented by communities. There are exceptions where communities apply for grants through outside organizations, and in these instances we expect to see that the community itself has initiated the project, and that an existing agreement with the intermediary clearly states the community will retain responsibility for implementing and continuing to develop the project over the long term.

## *Is the project holistic in its approach?*

In evaluating a grant application, we look for projects that incorporate social, environmental, economic, and cultural concerns equally while addressing the immediate needs of the community. It is essential that projects demonstrate an approach based on the interconnectedness of people, assets, and environment. We fund projects that nourish all of the community's assets, including traditional knowledge, community solidarity, and cultural identity.

## *Is the project values based?*

In essence, our grantmaking strategy focuses on values. The common values that Indigenous communities share include the concepts of reciprocity and sharing, respect, responsibility, caring for and honoring one another, and the interdependence of all life. We assess grant applications on a case-by-case basis and whether these concepts are present in the project design. We favor those that clearly incorporate these values into their work. We believe positive and lasting changes are always made with these values in mind.

# SUBMITTING YOUR APPLICATION

We only accept applications between January 1 and October 31. In special circumstances, we will consider an application after October 31. In this case, you must contact us before applying.

## ${\it Video\, Applications}$

First Peoples accepts grant applications in video format as an alternative to our written application. Your video can be composed any way you like but should depict your community's challenges and the solutions your community is using to overcome them. You should include multiple voices from members of your community. If possible, you should provide an English transcript of your video to help us understand the video's content. All submissions should include the following information:

- Your organization's name and any contact information you can provide
- The name and location of the Indigenous group submitting the video

First Peoples may request your permission to use your video on our website, in group presentations, and other media. Submit your video application via any of the following:

- Mail a DVD copy of the video to the Grants Coordinator at the address listed above. Submission materials will not be returned to you.
