• Emergency Overview:

- Danger!
- Harmful if inhaled, absorbed through skin or swallowed

Section 4, First-Aid Measures

Eye Contact:

- Check for and remove any contact lenses. In case of contact, immediately flush eyes with plenty of water for at least 15 minutes
- Cold water may be used
- Do not apply neutralizing agents
- Get medical attention immediately

Skin Contact:



- In case of contact, immediately flush skin with plenty of water for at least 15 minutes while removing contaminated clothing and shoes
- Cover the irritated skin with an emollient
- Cold water may be used
- Wash clothing before reuse. Thoroughly clean shoes before reuse.
- Get medical attention immediately

Inhalation:

- o If inhaled, move to fresh air. If not breathing, give artificial respiration
- If breathing is difficult, give oxygen
- Get medical attention immediately

Ingestion:

- o If swallowed, do not induce vomiting unless directed to do so by medical personnel

- o Loosen tight clothing such as a collar, tie, belt or waistband
- o Get medical attention immediately
