Calling Yourself a REALTOR® - When and How?

Sometimes there's confusion about using the term, REALTOR®. It's easy to see why since the term is often used interchangeably with "real estate agent" in movies, on television, and in day-to-day life. However, the right to market oneself as a REALTOR® is only granted once a person is a Member of the <u>National Association of REALTOR®</u> (NAR) and as such, <u>guidelines exist</u> to maintain the integrity of the REALTOR® brand.

When is it appropriate to use the term, REALTOR®?*

You can describe and market yourself as a REALTOR® after:

- 1. You have obtained your real estate license, and
- 2. You have completed New Member Orientation at GKAR, and
- 3. Your Membership has been approved by the GKAR Board of Directors, and
- 4. You subscribe to NAR's strict Code of Ethics.

Once you complete the steps above, you will be considered a Member of :

- Greater Kalamazoo Association of REALTORS®,
- Michigan REALTORS®, and
- National Association of REALTORS®

NAR is the exclusive owner of the REALTOR®, REALTORS®, REALTOR® Block "R" Logo (right), and other REALTOR® trademarks. You must be an official Member who follows the REALTOR® Code of Ethics in order to utilize them in your business.

"The REALTOR® trademarks are not synonymous with real estate agent, real estate broker or real estate professional. NAR will enforce against any misuses of its trademarks. Members may use the REALTOR® trademarks provided they follow NAR's trademark rules." -National Association of REALTORS®
