





Why green?

Exams day

- First things first the closed book exam
- Pilot pilot pilot
- 8 solutions tested
- BYOD from day 1
- Focus on the green box from day 1
- Co-operation with IT
- Trial and error
- Focus on students
- Good routines -back up machines
- IT resources
- Operations centre
- Stable solution
- Good monitoring tool





Why orange?

• Another new system?!

- Prepare the exam
- Teachers think they have done it right
- Paper hand ins
- More friendly user guides needed
- Solution not intuitive enough they just want to upload their question
- Insufficient skills in the administration the «experts»
- Faults in the solution
- FS integration we expected a smoother ride
- Huge amounts of resources required from administration

Why orange?

- Access problems (internal & external censors)
- Faults
- No annotation possibilities
- Group exams
- Exams with many censors



- Not intuitive enough «I did submit my grades!»
- FS difficulties lack of integration ++
- No plagiarism
- Finding the balance between formality and flexibility in the grading process!
- Huge amounts of resources required from administration digital packing

- No-one to look to...


