PROTECTING AND HEALING MORE CHILDREN

In May 2013, eight-year-old Gabriel Fernandez was beaten to death by his mother and her boyfriend. In spite of repeated reports of suspected abuse made by teachers and neighbors alike, the system designed to protect this child failed. His subsequent death served as the catalyst for intense scrutiny of a child welfare system in crisis, where resources and training are insufficient and caseloads overwhelming.

In response, the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors established The Blue Ribbon Commission on Child Protection which found that County agencies must, first and foremost, keep children safe. One key barrier to effectively protecting children, as identified by the commission, is that there are insufficient placement options for children who may be in imminent threat of physical or emotional harm or neglect.

According to the Children's Law Center of California, 100 children are placed into foster care in California each day, with 30,000 children falling under the jurisdiction of Los Angeles County Department of Child and Family Services every year. A significant number of these children enter care under emergency circumstances due to the imminent threat of permanent physical or emotional harm.

In the wake of Gabriel's death, County officials have—justifiably—begun removing children more quickly to prevent another tragedy, placing an even heavier burden on the few placement options that are available.

Maryvale, the oldest child welfare organization in Los Angeles, moved quickly to create the new Emergency Placement Center for Children which opened in February 2014. The Center provides immediate shelter, keeping children safe while helping them to begin the healing process. Children stay at the Center for a period of up to 30 days. Their experience while in Maryvale's care undoubtedly colors their perception of what kind of treatment they can expect from the child welfare system and—for many—the world at large.

Upon arrival, children receive medical attention, clean clothing and a bed of their own. The Center helps children reconcile their conflicting emotions about being removed from their home, begin the process of working through the effects of trauma, and lays the foundation for future success.

Using Trauma-Informed Care, Maryvale provides assessments, stability and care and creates an environment that

fosters a sense of hopefulness for the future. Once assessed, each child receives appropriate educational support, mental health counseling, psychiatric intervention, and a variety of other support. Ultimately, the information gleaned through the assessment process will help Child Protective Services and the dependency court more appropriately plan for the child's future care.

The Center's original 12 bed capacity was expanded to 14 in June, and recently

expanded again to 20 beds at the request of the County due to their continued need. Maryvale is the only organization in Los Angeles County that provides an Emergency Placement Program for boys between the ages of 6 and 12, and is one of only two such programs in the County for girls of the same age.

Maryvale is grateful to the Carrie Estelle Doheny Foundation who provided funding for the building's improvements and transition from an all-girls facility to one that now houses up to 14 boys. Your support helps provide these children with a safe, loving and healing home.

THE GIFT OF VOLUNTEERS

The children who come to Maryvale have experienced the brokenness and ills of our society through their own parents and family, so taking the risk to trust other caring adults is difficult, yet building such relationships is an important part of their healing.

Volunteers give our girls the opportunity to build healthy friendships with a caring adult mentor. Roberta Lara is one such volunteer who has made a real difference in the life of a Maryvale girl.



Roberta was matched as a Special Friend to a young lady at Maryvale in March of 2012. Over the past twenty-two months they have experienced many great times together, as well as times of heartaches and struggles.

When Roberta's resident moved on from Maryvale this past July, Roberta decided to follow her and continue to be her Special Friend. Today, Roberta continues to stand by the side of her Special Friend and provides unconditional love and support.

The friendship is not always easy because of the trauma her Special Friend has endured, but Roberta is determined to continue standing by the side of her Special Friend until she achieves full stability, and if possible, she hopes they will be friends for the rest of their lives.

At Maryvale, we encourage our volunteers to follow their Special Friends after they leave Maryvale because an on-going relationship with a caring adult is so important to their healing and learning to build healthy relationships. This focus on permanency for our girls requires a higher volume of volunteers, but we are willing to endure more work in order to achieve what is best for the children we serve.

FAMILY RESOURCE CENTER

Maryvale's Family Resource Center provides outpatient mental health services to children 0-20 and their families within Duarte and its surrounding communities. The program has continued to thrive and currently services over 90 at-risk and emotionally challenged families on a regular basis.

In collaboration with Montebello Unified School District and Probation's Prevention and Early Intervention Unit, to name a few, the Center offers an array of cutting edge groups and services including a support group for bereaved parents and siblings offered in partnership with City of Hope. Sr. Martha's Treasures

On January 6, 2015, Maryvale will celebrate 159 years of service to Southern California. It all started back before the Civil War when Bishop Amat, the first Bishop of the Monterey/ Los Angeles Diocese, petitioned the Daughters of Charity to come to California to provide a caring solution to the growing number of children who were orphaned or abandoned and found roaming the streets of the city then known as Pueblo de Los Angeles.

With a commitment to serving the poorest of the poor, five Daughters of Charity arrived in Los Angeles on January 6, 1856 by boat from their American Provincial House in Maryland to open Los Angeles' first orphanage and hospital

in the small wood-frame Wilson House on the site where Union Station stands today.

Over the years, Maryvale has evolved from an orphanage to an agency that provides healing and stability for foster youth, educates young children to provide the foundation for life-long academic success, and strengthens and empowers families by providing guidance, support and hope.
