OC MANUFACTURERS CELEBRATE NATIONAL MANUFACTURING DAY

Orange County manufacturers and organizations joined companies around the nation on Friday to celebrate the third annual National Manufacturing Day. The manufacturing industry employs approximately 9 percent of California's workforce, supports more than 17.4 million U.S. jobs, accounts for nearly 12 percent of the nation's GDP, and for every \$1.00 spent in manufacturing, \$1.48 is created for the U.S. economy. On National Manufacturing Day, manufacturers, associations and educational institutions open their doors to the public and hold events and tours for groups including media members, students and educators, community leaders, legislative representatives and local businesses. The national day was established in 2012 to expand the knowledge about and improve the public's perception of manufacturing careers and the industry's value to the U.S. economy. Several Orange County companies participated in the event, including Fullerton College, Planet Plexi, Purple Platypus 3D Printing Tour, Sandvik Coromant, and
