## INTRODUCTION TO INTER-COUNTRY (AKA INTERNATIONAL) ADOPTION

Orphaned children from around the globe are in need of forever adoptive families through inter-country (international) adoption. Children are waiting in orphanages and foster care around the world for mommies, daddies, sisters, and brothers. Can you be a family for a child?

## Orphaned children waiting for families are:

- Infants, Toddlers, Preschoolers, School-Age, and Teens
- Boys and Girls
- Single children and Sibling groups
- Children Abandoned or Orphaned by their birth parents
- Children Removed from their birth parents due to abuse/neglect
- Healthy Typical Children with the potential for normal growth and development
- Children with minor correctable medical needs (e.g. cleft palate, club foot)
- Children with on-going medical challenges (e.g. heart condition, GI difficulties)
- Children with developmental delays
- Children with minor special needs (e.g. limb deformity, cerebral palsy, hearing impairment, visual impairments)
- Children with special needs requiring life-long care (e.g. Down Syndrome, blind)
- Of diverse ethnic heritage (e.g. Eastern European, African, Asian, Hispanic)
- Living in orphanages or foster homes



These children are faced with unthinkable challenges as they strive to survive without a loving family. I will never forget the blank faces of the children lined-up on my daughter's orphanage patio strapped into bouncy seats and walkers staring at gray walls with no toys, music, books, pictures, or people to engage their developing minds. Loving families are needed for each of these children.



### Is your family able to parent a child adopted through inter-country (international) adoption?

- ✓ Can you open your home and heart to a foreign-born child of a different culture and ethnic group?
- ✓ Can you give love, comfort, security, and stimulation for a child?
- ✓ Can you learn how to support the social/emotional needs of a child adopted after infancy?
- ✓ Can you learn how to support the medical and developmental needs for a child with less than a perfect start in life or for a child with special medical and/or developmental needs?
- ✓ Would you be comfortable that you may not have the medical or social history of your child?
- ✓ Can you be flexible and patient with the unpredictability in the international adoption process?
- ✓ Can you take the time needed to travel to your child's country of origin for the adoption?
- ✓ Can you expand your family's cultural identity and incorporate your child's native heritage into your family life?
- ✓ Can you love a child that doesn't not resemble you and help that child to develop a positive race identity?

If you answered Yes! to at least five of these questions, inter-country (international) adoption can be the path that leads you to your child. Inter-country adoption is a wonderful way to provide a family for a child without parents and to expand and enrich your family.



#### So where do you start?


Your first step is to consider the needs of the child you may adopt. Put yourself in their shoes and ask yourself - are you the "right family" for the child. For example, if you adopt an African child will the child feel welcomed and will his/her racial identity be supported? Or if you adopted a child with special needs, can the child's medical, developmental, and social/emotional needs be properly meet within your family and community? You need to educate yourself and be honest with yourself so you can decide what type of child (e.g. age, ethnic heritage, special needs, siblings, etc) would be the "best fit" for the child and for your family. Adoption professionals at Family Connections, Inc. are available to help you explore your family's adoption plan. The Agency offers a free one-on-one consultation meeting for prospective adoptive parents to help you determine if international adoption is right for your family. Once you have envisioned your family and determined what is best for the child and for your family, you can then explore the numerous inter-country adoption programs that are available. A summary of inter-country (international) adoption programs is provided within this overview packet.

## As you consider inter-county adoption program you will need to determine if ...

- 1. The inter-country adoption program meets your desires in regards to the child you wish to adopt age, gender, ethnic heritage, race, single child or sibling group, typical child or child with special needs, etc.
- 2. You meet the eligibility requirements for adoptive parents in the country for which you wish to adopt
- 3. Your family can fulfill the travel requirements for the adoption program
- 4. You are able to meet the financial obligations of the adoption program
- 5. Can you accept the wait time for the adoption program

## Investing in the life of a child - How can you afford inter-country adoption?

Costs associated with an inter-country adoption support an array of services including (1) professional services (e.g. home study investigation, child background checks, travel preparation, adoptive placement, post-adoption supervision/support); (2) document preparation (e.g. dossier authentication); (3) foreign government adoption fees; (4) child care fees (e.g. orphanage donation); (5) passport and visa fees; and (6) travel expenses (e.g. airline tickets, food and lodging). The cost estimates associated with your specific adoption plan will be provided to you by your International Adoption Placement Agency. Depending upon your adoption plan, inter-country adoption costs can range from an average of \$25,000 to \$40,000. All fees paid in relation to your inter-county adoption are for necessary goods and services.



So how can you invest in the life of a child and obtain the needed resources for your inter-country adoption?

- ✓ Save, Save, Save (find ways to save money within your current household budget)
- ✓ Delay unnecessary expenses (e.g. remodel the bathroom another year, drive your car for a couple more years)
- ✓ Have fundraisers (e.g. rummage and/or bake sale, t-shirt sale)
- ✓ Encourage your family to gift you with adoption money instead of gifts on your birthday and holidays
- ✓ Ask a family member to gift you a part of the adoption
- ✓ Secure a loan interest loan (e.g. home equity line of credit, bank loan)
- ✓ Apply for grant money there are many organizations that provide grants to families adopting internationally
- ✓ Remember that there is a Federal Tax Credit for Adoption

#### The adoption process includes:



The inter-country (international) adoption process can be a little daunting at first, but with the guidance and support of adoption professionals at Family Connections, Inc. and your International Adoption Placement Agency, the adoption process will result in a forever family for an orphaned child. The rewards for you and the child are endless.

Home Study Investigation - this must be conducted by a licensed/authorized and Hague Accredited adoption agency in the state where you reside. Family Connections, Inc. is an authorized New York State agency that is Hague Accredited by the Council on Accreditation. If your international adoption placement agency is in the State where you live, you may use this agency to conduct the home study. However, many families use an international adoption placement agency that is in another State and thus need to find another adoption agency within their State to complete the study. Family Connections, Inc. has been conducting home studies for inter-country adoption for over twenty years and has expertise in the adoption process and successfully transitioning international children into their adoptive families.

Selection of a Primary Provider / International Adoption Placement Agency - to adopt a foreign-born orphan you will need to work with an International Adoption Placement Agency (aka Primary Provider) that has the authority to work in the country from which you wish to adopt and that has achieved Hague Accreditation from the Council on Accreditation. Family Connections, Inc. as your home study provider will work in collaboration with your International Adoption Placement Agency. A listing of potential International Adoption Placement Agency is provided at the end of this overview.

Citizenship & Immigration Services Pre-approval - all prospective adoptive parents must apply to Citizenship & Immigration Services (via forms I-600A or I-800A) to be pre-qualified to adopt a foreign born orphan. You must be approved to adopt a foreign orphan by the U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Service prior to applying to adopt from the foreign country. Family Connections, Inc. can help your family with your application.

**Submission of Dossier to Foreign Country** - every prospective adoptive family must submit a dossier - collection of documents that constitutes your application for adoption - to the foreign country. Your dossier may include documents such as birth certificates, marriage certificate, medical reports, criminal clearances, home study report, pictures, etc. Family Connections, Inc. has assisted hundreds of families put together their foreign dossier.

The Wait - then the hardest part - the wait for a referral of a child(ren). The wait varies with the country, the age of child, the number of children, and the health and developmental status of the child. Currently the longest wait is for a healthy young child and the shortest wait is for an older child or a child with special needs.

**The Referral** - your International Adoption Placement Agency (aka Primary Provider) will present a child(ren) to your family for consideration. You may receive a picture(s) of the child, a medical report, and a developmental assessment of the child. It is strongly recommended that you have a pediatrician with expertise in international adoption medicine to review the child's referral before you make a decision regarding the child's adoption. Family Connections, Inc. can refer you to qualified medical experts and support you through your decision-making process. Your International Adoption Placement Agency must give you two weeks in which to make your decision regarding the referred child.

**The Decision** - after your careful consideration of the child, you will decide whether or not to adopt the child. If you decide to commit to the child, you will proceed to adoption. If you decide that you are not the right family for this child, your international adoption placement agency, will present you with another child in need of a family when another child is available. All agencies involved in your inter-country adoption want you to be comfortable with the child you choose to adopt and prepared to parent the child.

**The Adoption** - you will travel to your child's country of origin to complete his/her adoption. Your International Adoption Placement Agency will facilitate your trip and adoption.

**Immigration of the Child to the United States** - After you adopt your child in the foreign country you will immigrate the child into the United States through the approval of a Citizenship and Immigration Services (via form I-600 or I-800) and the issuance of a Visa by the U.S. Embassy located in the child's country of origin.



The Transition Home and Required Supervision - you and your new child(ren) will settle into a new life. Most countries require that your adoption be supervised by an authorized/licensed and Hague Accredited adoption agency for a period after your arrival home to ensure that the child is safe and your family is adjusting well. The specific requirements for supervision are dictated by your child's country of origin and your International Adoption Placement Agency. The staff at Family Connections, Inc. really enjoys visiting families and helping them successfully transition into a healthy family unit. We welcome your questions.

Life Long Support for the Child & Family - as your family grows and your child develops you may have questions or need support. Family Connections, Inc. supports families throughout the life of the child. The agency has an annual picnic where adoptive families can connect and support each other and where kids from around the globe have fun and share their adoption experience.

### TIPS ON CHOOSING AN INTERNATIONAL PLACEMENT ADOPTION AGENCY (AKA PRIMARY PROVIDER)



Prospective adoptive families must employ the services of an International Adoption Placement Agency that has achieved Hague Accreditation from the Council on Accreditation to complete an inter-country (international) adoption. International Adoption Placement Agencies identify orphaned children for adoption in foreign countries, refer children for adoption to prospective adoptive parents, and facilitate the international adoption process. The family's International Adoption Placement Agency will work in partnership with the family's home study provider and post-adoption supervisor agency (e.g. Family Connections, Inc.) that is authorized/licensed in the state of the family's residence and Hague Accredited by the Council on Accreditation. The International Adoption Placement Agency can operate in any State within the United States.

Finding an adoption agency can be daunting and frustrating with so many agencies trying to get the attention of adoptive parents via print advertising, social media, and internet sites. It is

important that a prospective adoptive family work with an agency where they feel comfortable and confident. As adoptive parents research International Adoption Placement Agencies they should consider the following. An adoption agency should:

- Ensure that the prospective adoptive parents have the right to make their own decisions regarding their plan of adoption without influence
- Educate the adoptive family regarding all their adoption options
- Have the authority and experience to place children from the country from which the prospective adoptive parents wish to adopt
- Offer diverse adoption options working in more than one country of interest for your family
- Have the expertise in the type of adoption the prospective adoptive parents wish to pursue (e.g. infant/toddler adoption, older child adoption, the adoption of children with special needs)
- Provide training specific to the needs of the family and their adoption plan (e.g. attachment, adopting an older child, trans-racial adoption, parenting a child with special needs, family transitions, etc)
- Assist with the process of Citizenship and Immigration
- Support the preparation and submission of the dossier
- Arrange for the family's travel to adopt the child
- Facilitate the adoption of the child in the foreign country
- Guide the family through any post-placement/adoption requirements (e.g. register foreign adoption, obtaining birth data record)
- Support the adoptive family's emotional needs
