VOTERS GUIDE QUESTIONS

Why are you running for elected office?

West Central Minnesota needs a better voice in St. Paul. We need to have a vision to make our rural communities thrive rather than just survive. I have such a vision that includes a better business climate, better education, and improved infrastructure. I have the necessary skill sets to see that we achieve our goals out here and I am determined see our communities thrive.

Why do you consider yourself a pro-business candidate?

I have over 20 years of private business experience. Most of it is running my own businesses. I have also acted as a consultant on fairly large business initiatives that have created jobs and made companies a lot of money. I understand the necessary elements of a healthy business and for a strategic plan for growth.

If elected, what will be your top priority?

Economic issues (please provide details):

West Central MN is stagnating economically and it does not need to. However, tax policy and regulations are crippling growth and job opportunities. My top priorities will be to loosen regulations, reduce unnecessary fees and other bureaucratic impediments, and remove the horrible regulatory laws tying our hands.

Other (please provide details):

Education and infrastructure are lacking in out-state MN. There is a disparity in spending on our students and much of the funds we do receive are spent on cumbersome mandates by the state. That needs to be improved.



We need to build roads and not rails. The state's transportation budget is spent too much on expensive transit rails in St. Paul while our roads are eroding out here. I also want to see improvements on commercial rail out here as well as an improved fiber optic system for rural Minnesota.

TAX & FISCAL POLICY

To help Minnesota's economy grow, what strategy, or strategies, do you recommend for the Governor and the Legislature to enact in 2015?

- Improve Minnesota's business climate to foster economic growth and prosperity by reducing uncompetitive business taxes.
- Increase state revenue so we can increase funding for K-12 education, higher education, transportation, and other services that support Minnesota businesses.
- Make it easier to do business in Minnesota by reducing and simplifying business regulations.
- Reform state government to make government-provided services more efficient and more affordable for Minnesota taxpayers.

ENERGY & ELECTRIC RATES

HEALTH CARE

Which of the following approaches best reflects your position on what Minnesota should do to improve health insurance and the MNsure health insurance exchange?

Fix it - establish a health insurance exchange that complies with the minimum requirements under federal law and provides consumers the ability to shop based on provider quality as well as cost.

Do you support modifying the health care benefits provided through Minnesota's public health care programs so that they remain high quality, but are more in line with what other states offer?

Yes, we can reform and redesign our benefits to improve quality of care and save money.

EDUCATION AND WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT

In 2013, the legislature eliminated the requirement that high school students be able to pass basic skill exams in reading, writing, and math in order to graduate. Do you believe:

It is important that a student be able to pass basic skill exams to show s/he is college-ready.

Do you support legislation that would require school boards to use teacher performance as a factor in determining teacher layoffs, and not base layoffs solely on seniority?

Yes, school districts should use performance and not just seniority when making layoff decisions.
