They could easily recall the 3 R's; Recycle, Reuse and Re-purpose, impressing Mr. Lowery with their knowledge. This is the second year that Mr. Lowery has joined Mrs. Kathman's students for their recycling studies.

Mr. Lowry has been serving as the resident expert for his neighbors since he moved into Marjorie P. Lee. He has enjoyed sharing this passion with Mrs. Kathman's fifth graders. Mr. Lowry took the students through an exercise of recycling basics. After donning gloves, the students divided into groups to examine tubs of items that Mr. Lowry brought from Marjorie P. Lee. After the items were sorted, the students became inspectors and reviewed their peers work, making adjustments where they felt they needed to. 
