living in poverty (adult education and early childhood education). Daily I was inspired by the courage and perseverance our students brought to the learning environment. I learned so much about the struggles individuals face in life, the unimaginable obstacles they are able to overcome, and the role literacy plays in helping an individual transform his/her life and family. Over the years, our students have taught me far more than I could ever teach them. As a grant writer and Foundation director, I have tried my best to remember, and honor, that learning.

Which career accomplishments are you most proud of? I'm proud of what I was able to accomplish over the years with the help of dedicated staff members. First and foremost, I'm proud of the role I played in professionalizing both the adult education program and early childhood education program at IU13. When I started with IU13, there were no full-time career paths for adult educators. In the early childhood program (Head Start and Pre-K Counts), I helped to find grant money to increase the professional credentials of many of our instructors.
