- Conduct advocacy to enhance manufacturing environment in California

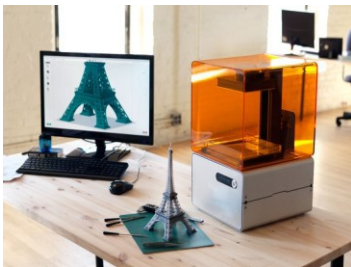
Reason for Action
