


Habits?

- Habits are "mental programs"
- We do what we do because we're programmed to do so
- We don't do what we want because we either don't have the right program, or...
- We access the wrong program

They Communicate With Their Mouth, Ears & Body

- 2 ears, 1 mouth, so... Ask, listen, coach - draw out their knowledge, rather than just stuffing it in
- Body language, gesturing...

- Change cadence, volume when talking

"Try not. Do or do not. There is no try." - Yoda




#5 They Provide Clear, Well-Defined Objectives




