Important! New Rules for Daylight Savings Time for 2007

New Rules for Daylight Savings Time for 2007

In August of 2005 the United States Congress passed the Energy Policy Act, which changes the dates of both the start and end of daylight saving time (DST). When this law goes into effect in 2007, DST will start three weeks earlier (2:00 A.M. on the second Sunday in March) and will end one week later (2:00 A.M. on the first Sunday in November) than what have traditionally occurred.

Uninstalling Internet Explorer 7

Many have found when they have installed Internet Explorer 7 it causes a conflict with other programs. If you installed Internet Explorer 7 and decide you want to uninstall and go back to Internet Explorer 6, you can find instructions how to uninstall Internet Explorer 7 on Microsoft Web site at <http://support.microsoft.com/default.aspx/kb/927177>

Blocking Installation of Internet Explorer 7

For those of you who do not want to include IE7 in the Automatic updates, there is a file in Origin's knowledge base that blocks the automatic update of IE7. **Block Automatic Update of Internet Explorer.**

They are simple - Block indefinitely, Prevent Auto update of IE7 etc. Please remember that at some point you **MUST** install IE7 as some future patches and updates will require it's presence.
