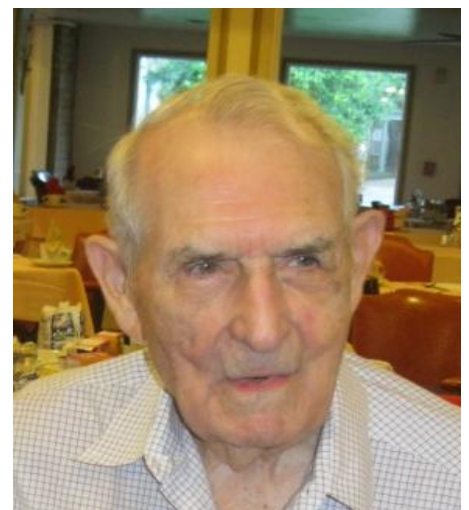

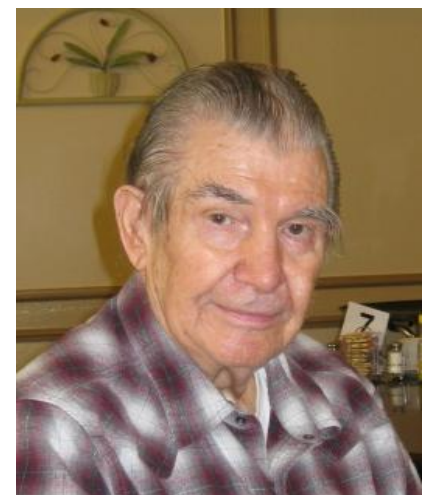

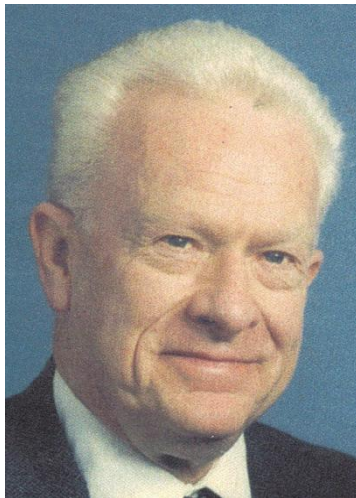

\*Seaman First Class Lewis Lagesse, age 19, was on the USS West Virginia at Pearl Harbor Dec. 7, 1941 when it was sunk by nine torpedoes. First listed as killed in action he was found to be alive, transferred to the hospital, and finished WWII on the USS Salt Lake City.
