

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Step 1: Would You Rather Vacation at the Beach or the Mountains?



Step 2: Focus on New Vocabulary Words





To soak something up

(casual phrasal verb)

Meaning: To enjoy something completely, to take it in, to absorb it and experience it

I want to soak up the sun while I am on vacation.



To end up doing something

(phrasal verb)

Meaning: The final result, what happens in the end

We thought he would travel the world forever, but he ended up settling down and having a son.

Boardwalk

(noun)



Meaning: A constructed pathway for pedestrians at the beach

On the weekends, New Yorkers hang out on the Coney Island boardwalk.


Serene (adjective)



Meaning: Calm, peaceful, tranquil


The lake is serene at dawn and perfect for fishing.





Meaning: The time when the sea level is at its highest

The water comes right to our front porch during high tide.





(noun)

Meaning: An inlet of the ocean where the land curves in

They keep their boats docked in the bay.




Meaning: Food that can be bought in a restaurant and carried out or delivered to the home

I don't feel like sitting in a restaurant. Let's get take-out and bring it to the beach.
