





Step 1: How to Be a Coffee Drinker in the US





"Can I get a ?"



This is a very casual way of ordering food or drink. It is not polite, but it's also not rude. It can be used in any casual restaurant or café.

"Can I get a large iced coffee with room for milk?"

"I'm gonna (going to) have a ____."



This is also very casual. It can be used in a fast-paced ordering situation.

"I'm gonna (going to) have a shot of espresso.


"Could I please have a ____?"



This is very polite. A parent might teach a child to order food/drink in this way because it is extremely polite. Adults can use the phrase also.

Could I please have a latte with a pinch of cinnamon?

"I'd like a ____"



This is also polite. It can be used in many different ordering situations.

I'd like a small hot coffee and some ice cream.

Sweetened

adjective



If a drink is "sweetened" it means that sugar or another kind of sweetener has been added to it.

I would like my coffee sweetened, please.

Black (coffee)

adjective



If you take your coffee "black" it means that you don't add any milk or cream

I'd like a medium, dark roast, black, please.

A splash of ____

expression



If you ask for "a splash of__" it means that you want a small amount of something such as milk or cream or chocolate sauce

I'll take a regular coffee with just a splash of cream.

Decaf (decaffeinated)

adjective



If you ask for a "decaf" coffee, you will get coffee that does not have caffeine.

Do you have decaf here?

Bonus step! The Tip Jar

In the US, it's common to see a tip jar on the counter at a coffee shop when you do not receive table service. Here is what you should do:

- For a small order, tip between 20 and 50% of the order (regular coffee, espresso, etc.)
- If you get a full meal at the counter, you can tip between 15 and 20%
- Consider the service that you received and the quality of the food to decide how much to tip

Additional Conversation Questions

- O What are some coffee-drinking norms in your home culture that are different from here? (example-taking coffee to go). What surprised you in the conversations about coffee drinking in the US in this module?
- Are you addicted to coffee/caffeine? Have you ever tried to stop drinking coffee? How did your body react?
- Would you rather meet a friend for coffee or tea? Why?
- What are your thoughts on coffee chains like Starbucks being opened all over the world? Are these chains taking away from local culture or providing convenience for people or both? Do you drink Starbucks coffee? What do you think about the quality?

Additional Conversation Questions

- O What do you know about Fair Trade coffee? Is there a Fair Trade movement happening now in your country? Why or why not?
- O Have you ever made a mistake or had a confusing situation while ordering coffee in English? Describe what happened?
