#### HOW GOOD JOB DESCRIPTIONS HELP MANUFACTURERS ATTRACT SKILLED EMPLOYEES

While it's important that companies in any industry create top-notch job descriptions, it's even more crucial for today's small and medium-sized manufacturers (SMMs). Manufacturing jobs have long been thought of as "dark, dirty and dangerous." Of course, for many positions this is no longer true, but that is the perception the industry has been saddled with. For younger and future workers, this perception makes a career in manufacturing potentially unattractive, resulting in a skills gap and many unfilled positions. With a large number of workers going out and a shortage of skilled workers coming in, Deloitte predicts that there will be a total of 2 million skilled manufacturing jobs unfilled by 2025 if nothing is done now.

While a great job description probably can't solve this potential crisis on its own, it can certainly help. The job description is likely to be the first exposure a job seeker will have to your company when looking for employment and, if done right, it provides the opportunity to explain the position, generate interest, and get them to your website to learn more.

CMTC Partner Provides Hands-On Training In Advanced Manufacturing Disciplines

Vocademy, The Makerspace (based in Riverside, CA) is doing what they can to help shorten the skills gap in manufacturing (2 million industry jobs are predicted to go unfilled by 2025) by providing members with the opportunity for hands-on training in over a dozen advanced manufacturing disciplines, such as 3D printing, electronics and robotics, industrial safety, laser cutting, machine shop and CNC, welding and fabrication, and more. Vocademy was also recently approved for its first federal and state apprenticeship program.The Maker Professional apprenticeship is a threemonth program which offers participants an opportunity to take classes at Vocademy and work on a temp-to-hire basis with a local employer.


