In the event of severe, prolonged pandemic, our responses will escalate accordingly.

Updated: March 19, 2020

LEVEL 1 - MONITORING

- Offices open
- Herbein is monitoring activities (locally and regionally)
- Provide preventative education campaign
- Initiate crisis response plan
- Consider postponing outside groups' events in our buildings
- Consider limiting face-to-face meetings when possible
- Consider limiting team member attendance at community events
- Consider alternative work arrangements by region
- Provide HR with voluntary travel locations
- Consider postponing all client-related travel
- Consider postponing all conference attendance and travel
- Self quarantine for team members who have recently returned from CDC Designated Level 3 Countries
- · Consider postponing team member travel in areas that are a focus of infection; reschedule as possible
- Consider self reporting to Human Resources if a team member has any concerns about possible exposure to COVID-19

LEVEL 2 - TRANSITION

- Offices closed for all external visitors
- Clients encouraged to submit information electronically or via mai
- Employees encouraged to work at home



LEVEL 3 - REMOTE

- Offices closed
- All employees working with remote access/working from home
- Clients encouraged to communicate via email or direct cell phone

FOLLOW GUIDELINES FROM CDC AND STATE DEPARTMENTS OF HEALTH

- Mandatory 14-day quarantine for any team member with a confirmed case or living with someone with a confirmed case of COVID-19.
- 14-day self-quarantine and monitoring for team members that travel to/from or who have someone living with them who has traveled to/from CDC designated Level 3 areas.
