Risk classification	Rationale for risk characterization	Hospital inpatient areas (Rochester Methodist and St. Marys Hospitals)	Outpatient areas (Gonda and Mayo buildings)
Highest-risk area	Immunosuppressed hosts reside or cared for in these areas	BMT unit, solid-organ transplant, hematology, medical oncology	Hematology and medical oncology (pediatrics or adult), transplantation, chemotherapy, HIV/AIDS
Higher-risk area	Patients with multiple severe comorbidity diseases reside or procedures in areas with water usage and exposure	Nontransplant ICUS, ORs	Endoscopy, bronchoscopy, outpatient surgery
Medium-risk area	General medical/surgery patients with no or few comorbidity disease reside, general patient areas, surgical areas, public areas	General medicine and surgery	General patient areas, surgical areas, public areas
Low-risk area	Nonpatient areas	Waiting rooms, etc	Secretarial and administrative areas
