Every Last One Discussion Guide

1. Greg said there are 25 million teens in the United States.

- How many teens are in our city or region?
- What are we doing to reach them and what else could we do to reach more?
- What “ships” do we need to “burn” to get to that outcome of every teen in our community having the chance to trust in Jesus?

2. Greg pointed out (through the dog story) that we can sometimes be the problem when it comes to inspiring our teens to share their faith because we aren’t modeling it or equipping them well.

- As leaders, how are we doing in sharing our faith? When was the last time each of us had a Gospel conversation?
- How can we better equip our students to feel confident sharing their faith?

3. Colossians 1:29 was used to illustrate the importance of staying focused on the mission and connected to God.

- What is the mission or “end” we are laboring for?
- How can we get better at escaping to pray? What are some habits or rituals in your life that have helped you develop a richer prayer life?

4. The illustration of Uncle Dave (the helicopter pilot) and his response to why he risked his life so many times should make us think about how we view our students.

- Do we look at the teens in our youth group the way he looked at those soldiers (as if they were your own kids)? What about the teenagers not in our youth group?
- How would having a greater sense of responsibility – to do as much as we could to rescue as many as we could from the danger, the darkness, and the devil – change our priorities and ultimately our ministry?
