We need to make sure your home is 100% ready for anyone who might book in order to move forward with the shoot. But don't stress – everything you need to do is below.

L١	WE	EK BEFORE THE SHOOT:
		Completely furnish and decorate your property
		Complete any renovations or landscaping
		Set up a lockbox or key code so the photographer can enter as a guest would
		Remove all clutter and personal items
		Fix any burned out light bulbs
1-:	2 D	AYS BEFORE THE SHOOT:
		Professionally clean and stage your property as it would be for guests
		Straighten and declutter all bedrooms – including making the beds and folding
		towels neatly
		Clear the bathroom of anything except the toiletries you'll provide guests
		Deactivate your automatic sprinkler system
BE		RE THE PHOTOGRAPHER'S ARRIVAL/PRACTICE CHECK-IN:
		Remove vehicles from the premises and close the garage doors
		Make sure all patios, decks, driveways, and sidewalks look presentable
		Remove these from view:
		☐ Grill cover
		☐ Garden tools, hoses, yard equipment
		Cables and cords
		All items on refrigerators
		Stacks of papers, such as mail or receipts
		☐ All trash cans or recycling bins (inside and outside)
		Open all blinds and window shades
		Turn on all lamps and light sources, inside and out (including fireplaces)
		Turn off ceiling fans
		For properties with pools and hot tubs:
		Remove covers
		☐ Turn off jets
		Remove debris and pool toys
		Optional: Set the dining room table with dishware, glasses, silverware, and linens
		Optional: Add flowers or a bowl of fresh fruit to brighten the room
