CLASSIFICATION

CLASS I

RISK ASSESSMENT:

Considered low-risk and present the least potential for harm



CLINICAL TRIAL REQUIRED?



EXAMPLES OF CLASS I DEVICES:

bandages, stethoscopes and surgical masks



CLASS II

RISK ASSESSMENT:

Higher risk than Class I devices. Necessitate stricter regulatory controls to confirm the safety and efficacy of the device



CLINICAL TRIAL REQUIRED?



EXAMPLES OF CLASS II DEVICES:

electronic thermometer, intubation sets and urinary catheters







CLASS III

RISK ASSESSMENT:

Devices either support or sustain life or present an unreasonable risk of injury to the user.
Subject to highest level of regulatory control.

EXAMPLES OF CLASS III DEVICES:

external defibrillators, coronary stents
