

Fritz Ruebeck has the all-American story. Down on his luck after being laid-off, he started a small business selling replacement control system parts out of his basement. Eight years later he employs 16 people in a bustling downtown Rochester warehouse that handles shipments to 46 countries around the world. A savvy business owner, Ruebeck was one of the first to enroll in the Small Business Energy Efficiency Program when a former colleague now working as an energy service representative for EnerPath approached him. He can use his savings to do what he knows how, continue to grow his business.

# **Program Goals**

Assess lighting in 15,000 small businesses over 18 months and reduce energy usage by 27.5 megawatts across New York State, in NYSEG and RG&E territory, by offering free energy assessments to small businesses and offering no-hassle installation of energy efficient lighting.





#### **Customer Results**

Installed 93 energy efficient lights with an estimated first year energy savings of 13,000 kilowatt-hours. Ruebeck paid \$1,728 and RG&E contributed \$4,032. He expects a 1.4-year payback on his investment.

## Program Results — 1st 10 months

More than 5,700 small businesses participated with an estimated 5 megawatt energy reduction.
