President Hook welcomed everyone and made introductions, including new president, Ryan Shaw

II. President Shaw introduced Kerwin Urhahn and Kevin Garner from MSHSAA 9:04

- a. Addressed getting rid of 3rd place game and having all Championships in one weekend. Basketball advisory board was against (2:1) so it stays.
- b. Addressed pre-season scrimmage – advisory board approved and will be in manual – not by-laws. More information to come.
- c. Discussed moving Football to earlier in the fall so players get a break before basketball starts.

Q & A With the Difference-Makers



CLOYCE KLEIN
Eldon School District

Coach Cloyce Klein has served student-athletes in the Central Missouri area in a significant way ever since the mid-1970s. He has taught at all three levels of the public school systems and coached basketball, football and track successfully at both the California and the Eldon School Districts and currently serves in a part-time, semi-retired role as the middle school athletic director for Eldon. Coach Klein counts his wife of 38 years, Lora, as a huge factor in allowing him to pursue his career in high school sports and couldn't be prouder of his children, Melissa and Matt and also the three grandchildren, Joscelynn & Evie Marriott and Justin Klein.

HARD COURT HERALD: As you look back on your career, what stands out as highlights for you as a coach on-the-floor/field-wise?

CLOYCE KLEIN: In football, getting that first district championship, then getting a few more. In basketball, it was when I first started at the junior high level being able to teach the fundamentals and over time see that carry over with the players as they played in high school and won tournaments, district titles and even played in the state championship game. When I moved to the high school level, it was winning the conference, playing for tournament titles and district championships. It was having that special team that went 23-3 before losing in overtime for the district championship. I received a few awards during those years, conference and district coach of the year but most of all, it was because of the special players I had.

In track, we were able to win six conference titles in 10 years, five times district runners-up and finish in the top 10 of the coaches' poll a couple of times. Seeing the athletes at the state meets win a medal was a highlight. Also, having an Olympic silver medalist wasn't bad either.

HCH: Same vein as the first question, what things do you look back on fondly that you experienced or achieved off the floor or field?

CC: I have met many coaches and media personnel in my tenure as a coach and many have become my friends. I have been fortunate to see many of my players go to college to play and others become coaches. I had the privilege to serve as president of the Missouri Basketball Coaches Association in 2001-2002 and got to know a legend in Missouri basketball in Gary Filbert.

My brother, Rodney student taught under me and helped me coach the sixth grade team that would later go on to play in the state championship game. Rodney became the head girls basketball coach in Ozark and was a two-time coach of the year there. I lost him a few years ago to ALS.

As a coach, my children lived in the gym and on the field. They turned out alright-one married a coach and the other could became a coach. Dad could not be prouder.

Last, I want to thank the coaches who helped me along the way and those who were my assistants. I tried to learn from them all.

HCH: A lot of people ask so we will here as well: what was Christian Cantwell (Olympic shot-putter from Eldon, MO who played for Coach Klein) like for you to coach and what stood out to you about him that you thought might make him great?

CC: Christian was a good-sized young man when he came to high school. He loved the weight room and just stayed in there and got stronger and stronger. I needed some throwers for the track team and I knew Christian could help us. I had to convince him that he could lift weights and do track. Lucky for me he had a buddy that I also recruited. His friend also medaled at State so we had a real one-two punch. Christian wasn't really interested in track until he began beating upper-classmen in the district meet. It was then that he became very focused.

Christian was an easy going, laid-back athlete. I would be looking for him and he would be up by the discus leaning against a truck eating a whole pie his mom had baked. One thing he enjoyed as much as competing was eating. He had a great sense of humor and was easy to coach. Christian was very quick for his size as well and was as big as any D-1 athlete you'd see. He would have made a great college center and deep-snapper in football. He was my post player in basketball and finished his senior season with our team having one of the best records in Eldon's history. When he got to Mizzou, the coach there made him the track athlete that he has become today. I read an article one time that his basketball coach was the track coach and made him go out for track and he had to obey. I just encouraged him a great deal and I'm glad I did.

HCH: As a former player of yours, you know how much I enjoy coming back to see you and get your take on things I've gone through and I KNOW I'm not your only former player that does that with you. For our younger coaches, what is that part of coaching like as it relates to having your old players still rely on you and what does it mean to you?

CC: Living in Eldon for so many years, I get to see many of my former athletes on a daily basis. Some are teachers or coaches in the district. Matt Davis, our superintendent, is a former middle school and high school basketball player of mine. Working now as part-time AD in the middle school, I see many parents who were my students. That comes in handy when I sub for the principal. It is quite rewarding to talk to them about old times or they tell me things they remember I said or did. I just smile because many times the memory is just not quite like it really happened. It is always good to see their faces and listen to the old stories though. It means it meant something to them and they still carry those memories with them.

I always considered the title of Coach to mean something important. I never took it for granted. I believe you have to earn the title and it brings a good feeling to this old coach when those players or students, some in their 50s, still call me "Coach".

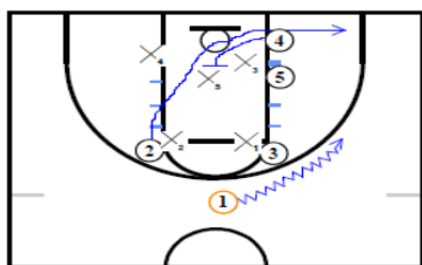

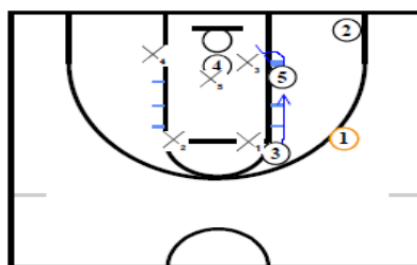
X (vs zone)

Frame B

If 2 or 1 don't have a look at the basket, 5 screens the low man on the zone for 3 to dive down for what should be an easy post-pass.

General Comments

This is a great play to run against a zone given the many options you have no matter how the defense wants to defend it.

Gary Filbert Lifetime Achievement

Dave Porter
Smith-Cotton, Poplar Bluff, Lafayette

Coach Porter is the Gary Filbert Lifetime Achievement Award winner for 2013. Coach Porter had a career record of 594-343 and was inducted into the MBCA Hall of Fame in 2003. Coach Porter first presented the idea of a Hall of Fame and was one of the driving forces behind the creation of the Hall of Fame. He is a founding member and two time president of the MBCA. Dave has also been the leader of the Jason Struble Memorial Cancer fund that promotes testicular cancer awareness at schools and basketball camps across the nation. To date they can confirm 23 saved lives through early detection.

Hall of Famers by the Numbers

The 10 coaches honored by the MBCA this year have amassed a record of 5015 wins and 2679 losses. They have coached 7,649 career games among them and won 65.6% of those games. The honored coaches have also won 80 conference titles, 75 district titles, they have coached in 21 final fours, 25 national tournament appearances and won 5 state championships as well as 1 national championship. The calculator would not add all of the coach of the year hardware owned by these coaches.

MBCA 2013 HALL OF FAME INDUCTION CLASS

Mike Davis –Central Methodist University, Columbia College
Coach Davis has amassed a career coaching record of 550 wins with only 276 losses at Central Methodist University and Columbia College. He currently has the 3rd most wins among active NAIA coaches in the nation. The 7 time conference coach of the year has coached 26 All-Americans, 18 scholar Athletes, and 8 Conference Players of the Year. Coach Davis' teams have won 10 conference championships and made 14 NAIA National Tournament appearances along with 5 Sweet Sixteens, 1 Elite 8, and 1 Final Four.

Rod Gorman – Logan-Rogersville
Coach Gorman has a 507-221 record in 26 years at Bourbon, Festus, Cape Central, and for the last 17 years at Logan-Rogersville. He has fourteen 20 win seasons, 11 conference championships, 13 district championships, and his team has played in the district championship game an unbelievable 22 times in his 26 years. Coach Gorman's 1991 Festus Tigers team won the 3A State Championship.

Steve Jenkins – Evangel University
Coach Jenkins has spent all 31 years of his coaching career at Evangel. In that time he has compiled 587 wins vs. 404 losses. He has been awarded the HAAC Coach of the year 6 times. In 2002, Coach Jenkins was the NAIA D-II National Coach of the Year, as his Crusaders stormed to the NAIA National Championship. His teams have made 11 National Tournament appearances and have 8 consecutive 20 win seasons.

Kevin Kelley –Troy (KS), Savannah, St. Joe Central
Coach Kelley has a career coaching record of 515-277. His teams have won 9 conference championships, 10 district championships, and have been to 5 final fours. His 1984 Troy, KS team completed a perfect 25-0 season with the 2A state championship. While at Savannah High School, Coach Kelley was awarded the Missouri Class 3A Coach of the Year award in 1999.

Mike Keltner – Glendale
In 15 years at Glendale High School in Springfield, Coach Keltner averaged 20 wins per season for a career record of 311-131. Joe McCraith began working as the scorekeeper for Hillsboro High School Coach and MBCA Hall of Famer Gene Steighorst 35 years ago. 5 years later, Joe began keeping the scorebook at Jefferson College. All told he has been on the sidelines for nearly 1500 games in Jefferson County and is still going strong and enjoying every moment.

Mark Nusbaum – O'Hara, Liberty, Rockhurst

Fresh off a 2013 Class 5 State Title, the Missouri Coach of the Year Award, and the announcement of his retirement, Coach Nusbaum has had a busy Spring. His teams have compiled a career record of 569 wins and 278 losses. He has won State Championships in 1998 at Liberty and again this season at Rockhurst. His teams have won 6 conference titles and 11 district titles. Coach Nusbaum has guided his team to the Missouri Final Four 6 times.

Jeff Walk – Twin Rivers, Three Rivers Community College

Coach Walk has a career record of 442-256 at Twin Rivers High School and Three Rivers College. His teams won 5 OFC Conference titles, 9 District Titles and Coach Walk was the OFC Coach of the Year 5 times as well as twice being named the SEMO Coach of the Year. At Three Rivers, Coach Walk has won 2 MCCAC Conference Championships and has been the MCCAC Coach of the Year twice.

Randall White – Scott City, Delta

Coach White owns an overall coaching record of 467-231. He was the 11 time conference coach of the year, 6 time region coach of the year, and in 2008 he was the MBCA Coach of the Year. His teams won 6 conference championships and 12 District Championships. His teams competed in the 2003, 2006, and 2008 Final fours.

Kenny Wyatt – Brunswick, Bucklin, Marceline, Salisbury

During the course of his 26 year career, Coach Wyatt owns a record of 519-200, including the 2013 Class 2 State Championship. His teams have won their conference championship an amazing 17 times in his 26 years. They have won 10 district titles and competed in 3 Final Fours. Coach Wyatt was the MBCA Coach of the Year in 2012 and 2013 and has won 15 other coach of the year awards.
