Who Was Kobe Bryant?

Kobe Bryant spent his early years in Italy and joined the NBA straight out of high school. A dominant scorer, Bryant won five NBA championships and the 2008 MVP Award with the Los Angeles Lakers. Although later seasons were marred by injuries, he surpassed Michael Jordan for third place on the NBA all-time scoring list in December 2014 and retired in 2016 after scoring 60 points in his final game. In 2018, Bryant earned an Academy Award for Best Animated Short Film for Dear Basketball. On January 26, 2020, he was in a helicopter crash that killed Bryant, his 13-year-old daughter Gigi and seven others.



Bryant's wife Vanessa posted on Instagram. ...and... "We are completely devastated by the sudden loss of my adoring husband, Kobe — the amazing father of our children; and my beautiful, sweet Gianna — a loving, thoughtful, and wonderful daughter, and amazing sister to Natalia, Bianka, and Capri." "There aren't enough words to describe our pain right now. I take comfort in knowing that Kobe and Gigi both knew that they were so deeply loved. We were so incredibly blessed to have them in our lives. I wish they were here with us forever. They were our beautiful blessings taken from us too soon."

What is Coaches vs. Cancer?

For more than 25 years, the American Cancer Society and the National Association of Basketball Coaches have collaborated to unite basketball coaches and fans through the Coaches vs. Cancer program to defeat a common enemy - cancer. Because of their passion and dedicated support, the impact has been felt in communities nationwide.

Through fundraising and education initiatives, the Coaches vs. Cancer program has supported the American Cancer Society in helping to save more lives from cancer. In fact, we've seen a 27% reduction in cancer death rates since 1991! But the fight isn't over, and we need you on our team.

Teaming Up to Save Lives

The Coaches vs. Cancer program was founded in 1993 by Norm Stewart, former University of Missouri head basketball coach, when he asked fans to pledge a dollar amount for every 3-point shot made by his team during the season. All pledges were donated to support the fight against cancer.

Tips and Ideas for Success

Coaches vs. Cancer and You

Sign up, recruit others, and fundraise. It's easy. And it's fun! Here's how to start.

- 1 Wear sneakers with suits. January 20-26, 2020, is Coaches vs. Cancer Suits And Sneakers® Week, a nationwide event when basketball coaches across the country unite for a common cause saving lives from cancer. Coaches and their staff across the nation wear sneakers with their suits during games to raise awareness and funds in the fight against cancer.
- ② Designate a home basketball game as a Coaches vs. Cancer Suits And Sneakers game where players, coaches, students, and the community rally in support of the American Cancer Society's mission. Games will ideally be held during Suits And Sneakers Week, but can be held anytime during January or the rest of the season when your game schedule permits. Raise funds. Raise awareness. Increase education about cancer prevention and early detection.

2019-2020 Coaches vs. Cancer Suits And Sneakers games will support childhood cancer research, services, and awareness, as well as promote cancer prevention efforts targeting children.*

*If your event has historically supported another American Cancer Society program, you may continue to do so. If your coach(es) prefer to support the full mission of the American Cancer Society, you may opt out of the restriction to childhood cancer.

- Identify a volunteer committee representing athletes, student body, school administration, athletic department, parents, boosters, survivors, web broadcasting, and marketing classes to organize the event and drive fundraising success.
- Encourage your fans to join in the effort by wearing their sneakers, and even suits, to your designated game.



Game-day fundraising ideas:

Rivalry Game or Tournament – Partner with your rival team(s) and designate your game or a tournament as a Coaches vs. Cancer Suits And Sneakers event. Host a fundraising competition in the weeks leading up to the big game(s). Announce the winner at halftime.

Pledge Donations – Email your fan base and/or have athletes, students, and other participants collect pledges for free throws, rebounds, steals, total points scored, or any other important stat during your designated game in support of the American Cancer Society.

Free Throw Challenge – Encourage each player on your team to shoot 100 free throws during practices and request pledges from family, friends, and fans for each one made. Collect all pledges to see who is the free throw champion!

Challenge other schools to join your efforts and start a friendly competition. Identify a player captain and campus or community captain to lead the efforts. **Conference-wide Involvement** – Challenge fellow coaches across your conference or league to designate a game or establish a tournament in support of the American Cancer Society. See who can raise the most money and awareness in the fight against cancer.

Gold or Other Color-out Game – This is often the most popular way to get the students, fans, and parents involved. Choose gold for childhood cancer or another color of your choice (if you choose to do so), and "color out" the entire basketball game site! Proceeds from shirt sales or admission can be donated to the American Cancer Society.

Sponsorship – Ask local businesses to sponsor your Coaches vs. Cancer game (or game shirts) or match fan donations or pledges collected. Local businesses love these opportunities! Colleges should be sure to work with their Learfield IMG contact first.



Andrew Kettel started his coaching career in 1998 as a volunteer assistant coach for the Scranton Prep Cavaliers freshman team, moving up to the junior varsity and varsity level in 2000. In 2002, Coach Kettel was hired as the head JV coach and guided the Cavaliers for the next four seasons accumulating over 60 wins. He also served as Athletic Director at St. Paul's School.

In July 2007, Coach Kettel was appointed the head boys' basketball coach at Lackawanna Trail High School, where he led the Lions to an overall record of 77-70, guiding them to two Lackawanna League Championship games, winning the trophy in 2010-11 season. That same year, the Trail boys' basketball team was selected as the recipient of the Scranton Chapter of PIAA Basketball Officials' Donald L. Klee Sportsmanship Award.

Between regular seasons, Coach Kettel has successfully coached a variety of age groups in the AAU regional programs at Hoop City & Backcourt Hoops, as well as participating with his teams in numerous summer basketball camps at Villanova University, Saint Joseph's University, The University of Notre Dame and Michigan State University.

Since taking over at Scranton Prep, Coach Kettel has led the Cavaliers to 114 wins and 20 loses, 5 Lynett Tournament Championships ('13, '14,'15,'16),3 Lackawanna League Championships ('15,'16,'17) 4 District II Championships ('15,'16,'17,'18). Kettel has an overall record of 191 wins and 90 loses.

Coach Kettel was selected as one of 50 Positive Coaching Alliance's 2017 Double Goal Coach National Winners presented by TeamSnap. Coach Kettel was also presented with the Walter Venesky Award by the Bochicchio Sports Initiative. NPF Sports named Kettel the 2017 District 2 Big School Coach of the year.

Coach Kettel has served as the chairman of Coaches vs. Cancer of NEPA since 2008. In that short time, his efforts have helped to raise over 1.6 million dollars. In April, Kettel was the first high school coach in the country to receive the Champion Award presented by the American Cancer Society.

After spending 10 years at the collegiate level, one year as the top assistant at Oregon State and 9 years at Clarion University, Scott returned to his roots in Western PA high school basketball in 2008-2009. Scott has taken on the task of rebuilding a DuBois Area boys program and in 2011-2012 season led the Beavers to the D9 League and PIAA District IX AAAA Championship.

During his time at Oregon State and Clarion, Creighton mentored the team's post players who earned two All-American honors and eleven all-conference awards. He has served as the recruiting coordinator, managed the team's offense, assisted in practice development and organization, was responsible for coordinating scouting of opponents as well as preseason and post-season player development. He conducted strength and conditioning workouts, scheduled games, supervised the team's managers and student coaches, co-directed Clarion's highly successful summer camps and assisted in virtually all other facets of the women's basketball program. In addition to helping conduct Clarion's Basketball Camps, Creighton has also served as a camp staff member at Duke, Illinois and the National Point Guard College.

Creighton spent seven seasons at Cranberry High School in Seneca, Pa. In 1994 and 1995, after five seasons as an assistant, he served as the girls' head basketball coach, guiding the team to a 61-2 overall record. In 1994, He earned PIAA "Coach of the Year" honors after leading Cranberry to a 31-1 overall record, winning their third consecutive District 10 and PIAA state title ('92, '93, '94). In 1995, Creighton's team finished 30-1, with the only loss coming in the PIAA state semi-final game.



College Spotlight



Dave Niland





Penn State Behrend head men's basketball coach Dave Niland enters his 26th season guiding the Behrend Lions program. Niland has produced 25 consecutive winning seasons to rank 20th among NCAA Division III programs for winningest teams of the decade. The Lions also have earned an NCAA or ECAC postseason bid in 23 of the past 24 years. Niland is the all-time leader in men's basketball coaching victories with 496 entering this season.

Last season, Behrend won its sixth overall AMCC Championship and advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the eight time under Niland's direction. The finished with a 23-5 overall record and 14-4 mark in the AMCC, while having three players earn All-Conference honors.

Niland has been named the AMCC Coach of the Year seven times— a league and college record. His teams have won seven regular-season league titles and six conference tournament championships.




