By registering for the Milton Park Red Nose Day Fun Run (Event) you agree to abide by these rules. Please check this page from time to time, as we may occasionally amend these rules and any changes will be binding on you. By registering for the Event you also agree to abide by any instructions or regulations displayed or given on the day of the event by officials.

Participant Entry

1. This Events is for Park occupiers only. MEPC reserves the right to ask non-park occupiers to withdraw from the Event at any time.
2. The Event is open only to participants aged 18 or over.
3. MEPC will only accept entries to the Event on the day where we are satisfied that it is safe to do so, given that the Event has an allocated capacity.

Health & Safety and Medical

1. The Event is non-competitive.
2. Any participant unsure of their physical ability to take part in the Event must seek medical advice from a General Practitioner prior to the Event. It is not advisable for pregnant women to run/jog (they can however walk if they like) the course as there could be trip hazards, and it is recommended that they should consult their General Practitioner before taking part in the Event.
3. Participants are responsible for ensuring that they are wearing appropriate attire (including footwear) when taking part in the Event, taking into account the nature of the Event, the weather forecast and the terrain involved.
4. First aid facilities will not be provided at the Event.
5. MEPC and CBRE takes all reasonable steps to minimise the risk of injury to participants during fundraising events. There is a stringent risk assessment process in place for this Event which aims to minimise or eliminate the risk to everyone taking part. By taking part in the Event, all participants acknowledge that there may be conditions or circumstances beyond our control that can lead to unforeseen risks. If you have any concerns or queries please contact us before agreeing to take part in the Event.
9. MEPC reserves the right to refuse entry to the Event if for whatever reason it deems a person unfit to take part.

Sponsorship Money and Donations

1. All participants have a legal responsibility to ensure that all sponsorship monies/donations received in connection with the Event are paid to Comic Relief UK, and we ask that you do this as soon as possible after the Event.
2. Please note that we will have representatives on site during the day to collect cash if needed.

Filming and Photography at the Events

1. By taking part, all participants, volunteers and spectators confirm that they are happy to be part of any video footage, stills or photographs taken during their participation in the Event. This may include, but is not limited to, television broadcasts, publications, marketing material and other documents that may be made available to the public.
2. Photographs of children (if in attendance) will not be used in this manner without a parent's or legal guardian's written consent. However, we may use images where children are incidentally included for example, of mass participation in the warm-up exercises or on the starting line. No personal details (including names) of an under 16-year-old participant will be used in any publicity materials without the written consent of their parent or legal guardian. We will not provide participants' personal details to third parties.

Liability

1. All participants entering the Event do so entirely at their own risk. MEPC or CBRE shall not be liable for any injury or loss to participants or their property that might occur as a result of their participation in the Event, other than in respect of any injury or loss arising as a result of MEPC's negligence.
3. All spectators attending the Event do so entirely at their own risk. MEPC or CBRE shall not be liable for any injury or loss that might occur as a result of their attendance other than in respect of any injury or loss arising out of MEPC's negligence.
