Tufts Pre-College Intensive (International Relations)

Description: Experience Tufts' distinctive approach to the study of International Relations by analyzing current and enduring global issues with faculty from the School of Arts and Sciences and the Fletcher School of Law and Diplomacy, by immersing yourself in intensive college-level foreign language training, and by living on Tufts' campus. Outside the classroom, this unique program will expand your social network while exposing you to Boston's rich academic and cultural offerings through several college and university tours and extracurricular activities.

Tufts Pre-College Intensive (Leadership for Social Change)

Description: Join Tufts University's Tisch College of Civic Life for an exciting, engaging, two-week summer program created for those who are passionate about making a difference in the world and having an impact on local and global issues. With a lens toward advancing equity, inclusion and participation in civic life, the program will equip students with the skills and knowledge to build connections, work collaboratively, and emerge as change agents who can inspire others. The students will also tour several college campuses in the area.

Tufts Pre-College Intensive (SMFA Studio Art)

Description: Join our community of working artists and immerse yourself in thinking, creating and making. While maintaining a focus on developing your unique artistic vision, you will take classes in the foundations of drawing, painting, printmaking, sculpture and installation. SMFA's interdisciplinary approach to art means that you are encouraged to explore and integrate different media into your art. Our working artists will guide you in this process and advise you on your portfolio. An optional third week following each session gives serious art students extra time for portfolio development.

Students can also choose to enroll in Studio Art Workshops or in one of our capstone College Prep Workshops. This program is flexible allowing you to take only the classes you need to meet your summer study objectives.

Harvard Pre-College Program

Whether you decide to attend for two, four, or six weeks, you'll be introduced to college life as you attend challenging classes, live on campus, and enjoy fun excursions and activities.

Harvard Secondary School Program

You may choose to enroll in one or two courses. Outside the classroom, you can attend workshops, take trips to nearby colleges, and unwind through activities like intramural sports and musical pursuits. You find a healthy balance of organized events and free time, allowing you the independence you will find in college.

Berklee Five-Week Summer Performance Program

Description: Berklee's Five-Week Summer Performance Program (Five-Week) is the world's preeminent summer musical performance program. With one-on-one instruction from Berklee's renowned faculty and a curriculum that offers college credit, this immersive program is designed to enhance the playing or singing performance skills of precollege and high school students. You'll learn how to play in a band, develop your improvisational and reading skills, improve your instrumental craft in weekly private lessons, and participate in classes and demonstrations by well-known faculty and visiting artists.

Boston University Summer Term: Academic Immersion (AIM): Intro to Experimental <u>Psychology</u>

Description: Introduction to Experimental Psychology is an innovative, three-week residential program that not only provides students with a broad introduction to the field of psychology, but also gives you the opportunity to learn how to design and execute research projects. In the mornings, participants in AIM's psychology track attend seminars on Boston University's Charles River Campus, engaging in psychology coursework and developing important research skills. You also gain exposure to the career paths available to those majoring in psychology. In the afternoons, you work in teams to design and carry out your own experiments under the supervision of Boston University instructors. You and your team members collect and analyze data in the field as research psychologists typically do. At the end of the three weeks, you present the findings of your experiments to your peers and other members of the BU community.

Boston University Summer Term: High School Honors

Guidance is provided to help students identify subject areas and courses that are appropriately challenging and applicable to their anticipated college major. Outside the

classroom, High School Honors students interact with a vibrant community from all over the country and world. Whether they live on campus or commute from home, students will participate in social activities both at Boston University and throughout the Boston area.

NYU Precollege

Pre-College Summer Session

Description: Yale Summer Session seeks motivated high school students who wish to enroll in Yale College courses for credit. In for-credit courses, qualified high school students will share the classroom with college students and will do college-level work. All participants will be held to the same set of standards. Pre-college students living on campus are required to be full-time students; they must take two course credits (the equivalent of eight semester hours) per session. No pre-college student may take more than two courses per session. A minimum of one of these courses must be taken in residence. Pre-college students are not eligible to participate in or take any portion of a Yale Summer Session Study Abroad course. Some courses are not open to pre-college students; please refer to the individual course descriptions for additional information.

Summer@Brown

Description: Each summer, serious students choose Summer@Brown to prepare for college success, and meet the challenges of Ivy League academics. Living and learning on Brown's magnificent campus, students experience the independence and responsibility of college life, as they make new friends from around the world - nearly all 50 states and 74 countries. Summer@Brown offers more than 200 courses that reflect the wide range of Brown University's "open" curriculum - providing students the skills necessary for success in college and guiding them in their exploration of potential majors. Without the pressure of formal grades and credit, students can immerse themselves in subjects they choose and experience the satisfying challenges of college-level academics. Outside of class, students participate in a rich program of events and activities. Days and nights on Brown's lively summer campus are filled with workshops, activities and events that help you make friends and prepare for college life.

To prepare young people to create positive change, this innovative program integrates three foundational components: study of a compelling academic topic, exploration of socially responsible leadership, and development of a meaningful action plan.

Pre-Baccalaureate Program

Description: During this seven-week summer session, students study alongside Brown undergraduates, in courses from Brown's first-year undergraduate curriculum. Subjects span the natural sciences and mathematics, the social sciences, the humanities, and the fine and performing arts. All courses are equivalent to semesterlong offerings, compressed into an intense 7-week-long summer schedule. Classes are typically small, facilitating close collaboration between students and instructors. Classes meet approximately 8 hours per week, and require at least as much work outside the classroom.

Drexel Materials Science and Engineering Summer Institute

Description: This program will give aspiring scientists and engineers the chance to learn about how atomic elements arrange themselves to form the materials that are all around us. Furthermore, the Summer Institute will emphasis how variables in processing of materials determine physical, mechanical, electrical and thermal properties. Through hands-on science and engineering activities, students will gain an understanding of how materials impact the fields of energy, biotechnology and electronics. Sustainability and nanotechnology will be a theme woven through all of the modules. The learning environment will include work in the Innovation Studio, a materials science and engineering laboratory, and the Centralized Research Facility with includes advanced microscopy equipment. The week will culminate with presentations in which students will discuss their results from group projects.
