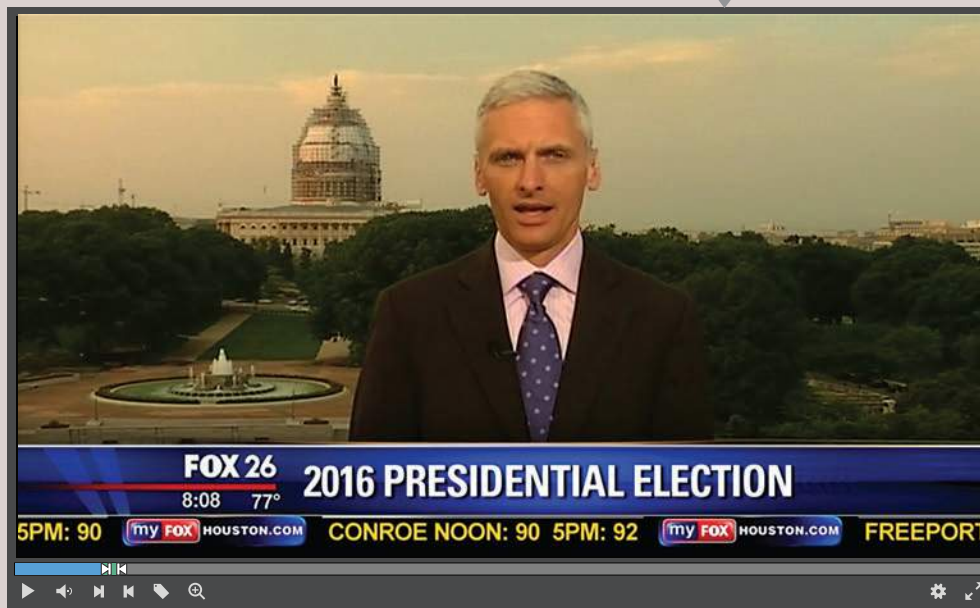

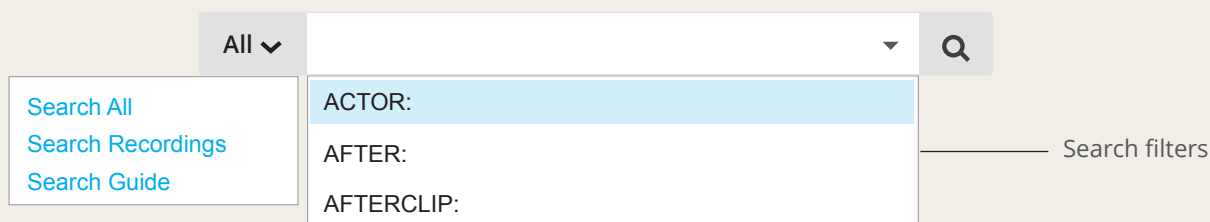

Auto-complete Search Filters



Filters	Description	Example Search
ACTOR:	Search only the actor field within a show or movie.	ACTOR: "Jennifer Lawrence"
AFTER:	Used to find results made after a date or time.	AFTER: 8/1/2015 13:30
AFTERCLIP:	Used to find clip results made after a date or time.	AFTERCLIP: 8/1/2015 13:30
BEFORE:	Used to find results made before a date or time.	BEFORE: 8/1/2015 13:30
BEFORECLIP:	Used to find clip results made before a date or time.	BEFORECLIP: 8/1/2015 13:30
CALLSIGN:	Search recordings made on a channel with a particular callsign.	CALLSIGN: KHOU
CATEGORY:	Search programs listed in a particular category.	CATEGORY: COMEDY or CATEGORY: DRAMA etc.
CHANNEL:	Search a particular network, callsign, or channel number.	CHANNEL: 1021 or CHANNEL: NBC or CHANNEL: KPRC
CREDIT:	Filter results to credits for a show (director, producer, etc.)	CREDIT: Spielberg
DATE:	Dates must be entered as a month/day or as month/day/year. Terms can be entered as a date or as a time period.	DATE: 8/1 or DATE: 8/1/2015 or DATE: LASTWEEK or DATE: YESTERDAY etc.
DESCRIPTION:	Search only within program description (general info, actors, etc.)	DESCRIPTION: Gaga
IS:	Filter results to a particular type of file. Recording search: AD, ARCHIVED, CLIP, ORIGINAL, SHOWSQUEEZE. Guide search: GENERIC, SPORTS, SCHEDULED. Both: HD, MOVIE.	IS: CLIP or IS: AD or IS: MOVIE -IS: HD or IS: SPORTS NOT IS: MOVIE etc.
TAG:	Search only specific tags. (time-coded and video tags)	TAG: Funny
TEXT:	Search only within closed-captioning data.	TEXT: Watt
TITLE:	Search information only in the title of a show.	TITLE: Ellen

Basic TV Search

Operators	Description	Example Search
OR	Search for multiple terms occurring together, or either separately.	SENATE OR CONGRESS
NOT or - (minus sign)	Exclude results containing certain terms.	APPLE WATCH -IPHONE
" " (quotation marks)	Search for an exact sequence of words.	"PARIS HILTON"
() (Parentheses)	Group words together in a search.	HOUSTON (ROCKETS OR ASTROS)

Fancy Schmancy TV Search

Operators	Description	Example Search
* (asterisk)	A "wildcard" search helps find unknown characters.	ENGL* results for "English," "England," etc.
~ (tilde)	A "fuzzy" search. Helps to find misspellings of words.	JOHN~ results for "JOHN," "JON," etc.
" " ~ (number of words)	Find keywords that occur within a specified proximity of each other.	"SENATOR MCCAIN" ~10 results for "Senator" and "McCain" within 10 words of each other.
