It's hot and humid here in Texas and if you're like my family you're busy spending these last long days of summer getting kiddos geared up with new backpacks and school supplies and making preparations to start another school year. The stark reality for millions of school aged children is that without our help, they will not have the opportunity or necessities to attend school this year.

It's staggering that over half of the children out of school are girls. **Sixteen million girls between the ages 6 and 11 will never enter school compared to 8 million boys. (**World Bank, SNAPSHOT Reaching Girls, Transforming Lives 2016).

At World Vision, we believe that *every* child deserves the chance to learn and reach their God-given potential. Ensuring equitable access to education leads to social and economic benefits. For instance, research tells us that a child born to a literate mother is 50% more likely to survive past the age of 5 (CARE).
