Bottom Line: The climate improves when conflict is resolved, not ignored.

Introduction:

Today, we're going to talk about another significant climate shaper ... **conflict**.

Conflict can negatively infect or positively affect the climate of any relationship.

When we don't positively deal with conflict, the relationship flatlines and the emotions freeze up. This results in a stuck relationship.

The climate of your relationships improves when conflict is resolved, not ignored.

We think conflict is a sign that something or someone is wrong, but it just means you're human. Conflict is inevitable. Conflict is normal.

How you chose to deal with conflict makes all the difference.

Conflict avoiders need to think: "I'd rather be bad at conflict than disloyal."

Conflict enjoyers need to think: "I'd want to hear as much as be heard."

Conclusion:
