



Saying No to Pride Psalm 10:4; Philippians 2:7-8 Message from Pastor Martin Hawley April 29, 2018

Bottom Line: Pride crowds God and others out of your life.

Introduction:

There's something that rises up in you that **keeps** you from ...

- Celebrating other people's successes.
- Initiating an apology when you know you're wrong.
- Being honest with yourself and others.
- Admitting you're lost (or) Admitting you've lost.

Admitting you don't know what you're doing.

There's something that rises up in you that causes you to ...

- Power up when you should be opening up.
- Cheat before you allow yourself to lose.
- Have to have the final word.
- Buy things to impress people who aren't even paying attention to you...

That something is **pride**.

Unchastity, anger, greed, drunkenness ... are mere flea bites in comparison.

Pride leads to every other vice.

-- C. S. Lewis, Mere Christianity

Pride diminishes you.

Pride diminishes your capacity.

Pride crowds others out.

Pride crowds God out.

In his pride the wicked does not seek him; in all his thoughts there is no room for God.
-- Psalm 10:4

Pride is a prison.

Is shuts you in and shuts God and others out.

When you accept the invitation to follow Jesus, you accept an invitation to un-follow pride.

Greatness is measured in terms of service (Matthew 20:28).

The "meek" shall inherit the earth (Matthew 5:5).

Jesus washed his followers' feet.

Jesus initiated reconciliation. Don't wait, initiate!

Philippians 2:7-8, "He [Jesus] made himself **nothing**, taking the very nature of a **servant**, being made in human likeness. And being found in appearance as a man, he **humbled** himself and become obedient to death – even death on a cross."

Three questions to identify **pride** in your life?

- 1. How does pride manifest itself in you?
- 2. What does pride masquerade as in you?
- 3. How much longer do you plan to let pride control you?

Conclusion:

Don't play with pride. Destroy it!

Say, "Pride, you are not my master, warden, boss, or boyfriend."				
Watch this pride, I'm going to apologize, compliment, write a thank you note, listen and keep my mouth shut, stop arguing, double the tip, admit that I can't keep up, and tell my Community Group that				
'm refusing to be <i>small</i> anymore.				
I'm going to <i>kill</i> my pride before it <i>kills</i> me.
