

Plan for It Matthew 5:1-10,7:24,26 Message from Pastor Martin Hawley February 12, 2017

The Bottom Line: Happiness is not immediately accessible, but it's not out of reach. It's a result. It's sowing and reaping. Happiness is determined by outcome.

Introduction: Q: What makes you happy? A: **No** Thing. Happiness is more about *who* than *what*.

Myth: God doesn't want you to be **happy**. He wants you to be **holy**. As we will see, these two are not exclusive.

Truth: Jesus knows more about happiness than anyone else. Why would God create such extraordinary capacity and not want you to fulfill it through Him?

Jesus began his ministry with a sermon about happiness.

"Blessed" means "fortunate, happy." In the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus gave a description of happy people. He spoke about eight "blessed are" categories.

Warning: They are completely countercultural.

Poor in spirit: people who embrace their daily **dependence** on God, regardless of what they have.

The moment you put your trust in riches, instead of Him who richly provides, you are **unhappy**.

Fear of **dying** will rob you of the joy of **living**.

Meekness: A proper **estimation** or **valuation** of oneself within the broader context of God's creation and love.

Happy are those with no guilt, no regret, and clear conscience.

Happy are the **relationally** generous.

Happy are the **reconcilers**.

Happiness is powered by the law of the harvest.

Happiness in an outcome.

Happiness is not immediately accessible.

You **reap** and **sow** your way to happy.
