Required materials:

- Laptop (Mac or PC) with Adobe Illustrator installed. You should be familiar with whatever computer you bring. **Adobe Illustrator should be version CS6 or newer. Adobe Creative Cloud preferred.**
- Charging cable for laptop
- External thumb drive (min 32gb)
- Sketchbook and pens/drawing materials
- Existing artwork, such as drawings, paintings, prints, and collage materials, such as found papers, decorative papers, newsprint.
 - **For found papers or artwork that is smaller than 11x17"**, these can be digitally scanned on-site at the start of the workshop, if needed, or can be scanned/photographed at home and brought to the workshop on an external hard drive.
 - **Any artwork larger than 11x17" (or 3D objects)** must be photographically documented in advance of the start of our workshop and brought in as digital image files on an external hard drive.
 - **In addition to traditional media-based work, bring at least 10 digital photographs you have taken that you feel demonstrate strong compositional elements.** At least 5 images should be patterns/textures/backgrounds that do not have a focused subject. At least 5 images should have a specific subject matter (portraits, landscapes, animals, floral, environmental shots, etc). These can be .JPEG or .PSD files, and will be blended with additional media in a collage exercise.

Optional materials:

- Laptop mouse
- Headphones
- Wacom tablet or comparable drawing table – must be compatible with your computer/have all device drivers and software pre-installed.
- Digital camera/image capture device
